

# **ANR Institute for Multicultural Students-Bilingual (AIMS-B)**

The ANR Institute for Multicultural Students-Bilingual (AIMS-B) is a one-week program sponsored by the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR) at Michigan State University (MSU).

## What is AIMS-B?

AIMS-B is designed to give bilingual high school students broad exposure to the food and agricultural sciences, natural resources and related fields.

A career in agriculture or natural resources involves a lot more than farming. There are a wide variety of educational and career opportunities in the food and agricultural sciences, agricultural engineering, and environmental and natural resources management, as well as other areas including environmental science, agribusiness and agriculture education. Many high school students are not aware of these opportunities.

# Who can participate in AIMS-B?

High school students in 9th through 11th grades can participate in AIMS-B. Most of our student participants are previously unfamiliar with the broad and diverse fields involved in the agriculture and natural resources industries. They are open-minded and interested in learning about these new and different areas.

Students are selected for AIMS-B based on interest and academic performance in high school. They are known by their teachers and counselors as students who are interested in science, math, business or related areas.

# What will I do as an AIMS-B participant?

You will participate in demonstrations, tours and other hands-on activities designed to give a sampling of what agriculture and natural resources fields have to offer. You will also have the opportunity to participate in a number of other educational, cultural and social activities.

During your week on campus, you and other AIMS-B participants will join with students from the Multicultural Apprenticeship Program for evening leadership seminars and social activities. Students from both programs live in the university residence halls and have meals in the dining halls with students from other summer programs.

# **How much does AIMS-B cost?**

Students participate in AIMS-B free of charge. The program is supported by the MSU CANR and a number of other public and private agencies and corporations. Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from the MSU campus.

To apply for AIMS-B, you should submit the following completed items:

- AIMS-B student application
- Essay questions
- An official transcript (including classes in progress)
- One letter of recommendation
