## 2016 MSU Dairy Challenge

The 18<sup>th</sup> annual MSU Dairy Challenge was held on November 30 and December 7, 2016 for MSU students with an interest in dairy. The competition provides students with the opportunity to evaluate dairy farm management in a fun and educational setting. Participants in the MSU Dairy Challenge have the opportunity to be invited to attend the Midwest Regional Dairy Challenge, the Dairy Challenge Academy and the North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge.

Ninety undergraduate, Ag Tech and veterinary students participated in the event held at Spitzley Dairy Farm, owned by Chris and Ryan Spitzley of Portland. The advanced division consisted of seven teams, the novice division had eight teams, and the Ag Tech division included five teams. Students in the advanced division must have completed the advanced dairy management course. Each team in the novice division was mentored throughout the process by a recent alumnus of MSU and the Dairy Challenge program.

Day one of the two-day competition began with each team visiting the Spitzley Dairy Farm near Portland, host for this year's event. Before visiting the dairy, each team reviewed a packet of information including production and farm management data. After a visit to the dairy and an interview with farm personnel, team members worked together to develop a comprehensive program that includes recommendations for herd management. Students were tasked with identifying and prioritizing potential areas of improvement.

On day two, teams presented their recommendations to a panel of judges. Students fielded questions from each of the judges following their presentation. Equally important in the learning process was the oral feedback provided by the panel of judges to each team. The evening concluded with a dinner and recognition program.

The winning team in the novice division included Leta Larsen (freshman in Agribusiness Management from Scottville), Madeline Meyer (freshman in Animal Science from Ionia), Allison Schafer (freshman in Agribusiness Management from Westphalia) and Riley Smith (junior in Animal Science from St. Johns). The second-place team included Brandon Goering (sophomore in Animal Science from Archibold, OH), Ellen Launstein (junior in Animal Science from Mason), Jared Sanderson (sophomore in Animal Science from Sandusky), and Eric Vigansky (junior in Animal Science from Stevensville).

The winning team in the advanced division included Nicole Chase (junior in Agribusiness Management from Conklin), Michael Herman (senior in Animal Science from Sebewaing), Emily Peacock (senior in Animal Science from Morley) and Marin Western (senior in Animal Science from Kingston). The second-place

team included Suzanna Hull (junior in Animal Science from North Adams), Michael Pell (senior in Agribusiness Management from Fremont), Allison Pung (senior in Agribusiness Management from Portland), and Rebecca Swartzendruber (senior in Agribusiness Management from Bay Port).
