CLINIC REGISTRATION

Registration is \$100 per horse/rider. Auditing the session will be \$40 per person. Registration includes box lunch and break, and a clinic proceeding. No refunds will be provided after 6/1/08. All forms should be postmarked by 6/1/08. Clinic riding positions may be held over the phone with a credit card.

Riders may bring one horse with a current (December 1, 2007 or later) negative Coggins certificate. For maximum benefit, clinic horse must be rideable, however advanced training is not required. Riders should bring a broken mouth-piece bit, an English or Western saddle and split reins (regardless of seat).

All riders are strongly recommended to ride in an approved riding protective head gear. Any participant who chooses not to ride in protective head gear must sign a Riding Helmet Waiver.
