Apply for a 2021 4-H State Award!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards (13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.

Youth ages 15-19 are invited to apply for the new Michigan 4-H LGBTQIA+ Alliance leadership team to help create a friendly, positive environment for Michigan youth and communities. The Michigan 4-H LGBTQIA+ Alliance is the brainchild of two Michigan 4-H teens who attended the <u>2020</u> <u>National 4-H True Leaders in Equity Institute</u> and were inspired to create positive change in their 4-H community.

Applications are being accepted for the teen leadership team that will serve as advisors for the statelevel Alliance. These leaders will develop leadership skills and help to create opportunities for LGBTQIA+ youth and allies to come together in fun, positive, and supportive ways. While this group is being established through Michigan 4-H, youth do NOT need to be 4-H'ers to apply; this opportunity is open to all teens interested in supporting the inclusion and participation of LGBTQIA+ youth and allies in Michigan 4-H.

Teen leaders will meet two to three times per month and should plan on committing about three hours of their time each month. The first meeting will be in April. This teen leadership team is just the beginning; additional opportunities will be available for youth who wish to serve on regional or local Alliance leadership teams, as well as join and participate as members.

Community Service GooseChase Challenge

Calling all Cass County 4-H members! Are you ready for a challenge?!?

We are excited to announce a very unique challenge between 4-H members of Cass County and 4-H members of Berrien County that could benefit many people in both counties while having fun! This will be a community service contest between the two counties following the popular "GooseChase" app online. In this time of safe distancing, it's super hard to find activities our youth can get out and do, and this could be fun opportunities for families to work safely together as a unit, earn points in the contest and make a difference in our communities.

The contest will run from April 8-14 and youth will need to sign up by April 13. There will be prizes for the winning county as well as prizes for individuals at the end of the 'chase'. Youth can choose from working in the county parks (trail maintenance, painting, planting flowers), making T-shirt dog toys, doing "shout outs", cards to nursing homes, appreciation letters, doing a virtual demonstration, homemade blankets, or providing hygiene items for foster care among other activities. The community service must make an impact in the county in which they live to be credited in the contest.

"This challenge is open to anyone between the ages 13 and 19 (younger youth can participate with an older sibling or parent/guardian), the only requirement is that you must be signed up in 4-H, which is free this year!" says Harman, "I know we've got a great group of families in Cass County providing services to our community... and so does Berrien County. We are hoping to make this challenge one to remember, and maybe get other counties to do the same!"

Youth ages 5-19 interested in signing up for 4-H this year may do so by going to 4-H Online (<u>https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in</u>) under the "Events" tab! This challenge is completely free, but you will need a smart device to participate (phone, tablet or computer).

Cass County Boards = Opportunities for Young Adults!



These dates follow the trend of previous years. Please check frequently as new, solidified dates become available. Please check the Cass County Fair Facebook page for validation information.

Blue Ribbon Entry/Pen Reservations

All fair registrations will be done online using the Blue Ribbon website. No paper forms will be permitted. There will be workshops provided during the registration period for those that need assistance. Dates and locations will be determined and announced at a later date. All fair entries registrations will be due on June 17, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED! As a reminder, please remember that fair registration is NOT the same as 4-H enrollment. When signing up as a 4-H member, you use the 4-H Online 2.0 system and when registering for the fair you use the Blue Ribbon system.

There will NOT be mandatory pen reservations. Some species may continue to use a form, but failure to turn them in will not result in ineligibility to exhibit at the fair. The species that decide to have a paper form will be noted in upcoming Clovers. These forms will be available in our office once online registration launches.
