QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must possess or be eligible for a valid Michigan Secondary Teaching Certificate with an Occupational (vocational) endorsement (HX – Agriscience and Natural Resources, VA – Vocational Agriculture (Agriscience and Natural Resources))
- Must <u>either</u> possess Interim Occupational Certificate (IOC) <u>or</u> Occupational Education Certificate (OEC) in Applied Horticulture and Horticulture Operations or Agriculture Science and Natural Resources
- Must possess valid Michigan teaching certificate endorsement in one or more core subject science area (Biology, Integrated Science, Chemistry, etc.)
- Must meet Federal Highly Qualified Teacher requirements
- Ability to demonstrate:
 - the strong desire and ability to build meaningful, caring relationships with students and adults
 - the ability to collaboratively create and deliver clear, engaging, challenging instructional plans that produce proven student learning
 - The commitment to coordinate instruction within and across grade levels
 - The aptitude to discuss subject-specific content instruction
 - The drive to innovate new ideas and use research-based best practices to improve student learning
 - The capacity to align curriculum, instruction, and assessments while responding to the individual needs of students
 - o The competence to collect and analyze data to inform instructional decisions
 - The ability and desire to design and utilize formative assessments to modify and adjust instruction on a daily basis
 - The ability to help create and thrive in a professional environment that is one of mutual respect, teamwork, and accountability
 - The ability to seek out knowledgeable peers, coaches or administrators for instructional support in the never-ending quest to deliver the vision of high quality, subject-specific instruction in every class period, every day
 - The skill and willingness to leverage the student support network to ensure that students' social, emotional, nutritional, and health needs are addressed
