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CONTEXT AND HISTORY - ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY STRUCTURAL RACISM PRESENT IN US FOOD SYSTEM

- Equity lens critical for MI Good Food Charter
- Center developed its racial equity plan in 2014
- All Center staff required to have a racial equity professional/programmatic in POW (starting 2015)
- WHY BIBLIOGRAPHY? Local food systems practitioners (many white practitioners) little background structural racism in food system
 - Part of plan of work for 2015



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ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY - CONTENT

- Criteria focus on peer reviewed and other publications within past 10 years that examine structural racism issues within the US food system
- Does not include blogs and newspaper articles because of sheer volume
- First edition released in early 2015; lots of feedback on first two editions
- Started process for 4th edition with a national request for citations – fall 2016
- 4th edition has 55 new citations
- DOI number and/or links are included where possible
- Plan keep going! # of publications rapidly increasing

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VALUE OF ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY

- Easier to select reading for own self-study
- Useful for students and teachers at multiple levels in higher ed
- Resource for food systems, ag, health organizations intentional about incorporating racial equity in food systems space
- Opens the door for civil discourse on racial equity and food systems
