Sale of counterfeit agrochemicals booms at Kejetia terminal

THE Kejetia terminal and its surroundings in Kumasi have been identified as the hub of the sale of counterfeit agrochemical products in the country.

The resultant effects of the nefarious activities of these unscrupulous businessmen, are untold hardship to farmers due to low harvest and possible health hazards to consumers of such farm produce.

The practice also put the lives of farmers and other workers involved in the value chain process in danger as they come into contact with these fake chemicals since they may not have all the necessary information

agrochemical products to succeed in their trade.

Confirmation

The Ashanti Regional Director of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Kwaku Minta Fordjor, who confirmed this to the Daily Graphic explained that Kumasi was becoming the hub for this illegal activity due to its central location, as it was easier to connect to other regions from Keietia.

Earlier, Mr Frederick Brandford Boampong, the Programme Manager for Crop Life Ghana, a non-governmental organisation had indicated at a day's anticounterfeiting workshop for stakeholders in the agrochemical industry that some of the counterfeiters had perfected the

Strategy: Ensure stakeholders can recognize counterfeits & illegal pesticides.

Activity: Training of farmers (FBOs), users, dealers and enforcers (customs, pesticides inspectors & control agents, police....).

Strategy: Ensure stakeholders can take proper actions.

Activity: Capacity enhancement for those who can take actions (regulators, registrars, adm./Traditional Authorities...)

Strategy: Lobby/Influence decision makers

Activity: Advocacy towards stakeholders that can make changes (gov. authorities MinAgric., regulators/registrars....)












Objective: Ensure access to quality products

Activity: Spray Service Provider (SSP), an individual (ideally a farmer) who

- has received a special training to handle and apply pesticides.
- is linked to reputable suppliers (ideally member companies of the local association) to access to quality pesticides.
- hires out his services to (fellow) farmers to spray their farms.












SUMMARY

CÔTE D'IVOIRE & GHANA (Burkina F.): "Combating the illegal trade of Pesticides Regionally".



- Sensitization and capacity strengthening for borders control agents: Customs, Pesticides Inspectors Police, Forestry & Immigration agents.
- Sensitization of regulators/registrars, importers, distributors/retailers/dealers, Farmers and FBOs during stewardship campaigns and products promotion.
- Joint Control Côte d'Ivoire-Ghana (initiative of MoA) by the Regulatory authorities of both countries (1st meeting May 17, 2018 in Abidjan).
- Media Coverage/Reporting of the training and sensitization workshops.
- Côte d'Ivoire: Interministerial (Ag, Security and Interior, Budget) decree for CDLPI chaired by local adm. authorities and involving key stakeholders.
