REMINDERS FOR VOLUNTEERS

Please keep in mind that anyone volunteering with 4-H programs must complete MSU Extension's volunteer selection process and remain up-to-date with annual trainings and background checks.

Background checks will now be run automatically during your birth month. You will receive an email notification on the 15th of the month prior alerting you to this and asking you to update any information that may have changed in the past year. If you are resigning, please contact the office so we can shut off this process.

All current volunteers will need to complete the Child Abuse Reporting Protocol Training by December 31, 2022 to maintain their Gold status. You can complete this module anytime in Volunteer Central. New volunteers will complete this training as part of the onboarding process.
