## **VOLUNTEER UPDATES**

The process for current volunteers is changing:

- You do NOT have to re-authorize your background check. Annual background checks will be run automatically during your birth month. You will receive an automated email on the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month prior. If none of your information has changed, you do not need to do anything further. Please update any information that has changed prior to your birth month. If you are resigning and the background check does not need to be run, please contact the office so that we can mark your as resigned and shut off this process.
- You also do NOT have to renew the Code of Conduct every year. On occasion, the Code of Conduct is updated and if this occurs you will be given a 3-month window to review and sign the new version.
- Remember Gold Volunteers MUST complete the Child Abuse Reporting Protocol training by December 31<sup>st</sup> to stay active. You can complete this module anytime in Volunteer Central or attend one of the following trainings on Zoom.
