



Certificate Programs

Students earn a certificate upon successful completion of 12 credits (normally four courses) from applicable online courses through IFLR.

Requirements for Certificate in International Food Law

- Total of 12 credits (normally four courses).
- Three or more credits (one course or more) must be from the following:
 - FSC 810 International Food Laws and Regulations
 - \circ $\;$ FSC 812 $\;$ Food Laws and Regulations in the European Union
 - o FSC 816 Codex Alimentarius The Food Code
- And no more than one U.S.-focused course.

Requirements for Certificate in United States Food Law

- Total of 12 credits (normally four courses).
- Three credits must be from "FSC 811, Food Laws and Regulations in the United States."
- And no more than one internationally-focused course.

Interested in both certificates?

- Three credits can be applied toward both certificates.
- Students may therefore earn both certificates after 21 credits (seven courses) credits instead of 24 credits (eight courses).
