Aim High - The club discussed the upcoming fair related entry requirements, rocket project option for kids, families planning to do 4-H camp cleanup, and a couple of other community service projects the club planned and participated in. Members and families then discussed the various needs to help with A Day with Dr. Pol. Many will be making items for the bake sale, helping with set up, and working different shifts at the event.

Country Neighbors - April has been very busy. We have been doing different demonstrations on how to do events at the fair during our meetings. Our club cleaned the train depot station and the park by the Bridge and Beacon gas station in Shepherd. We also put on a petting zoo, bake sale and face painting during the Maple Syrup festival. During that time, we were raising funds and items for HATS.

All of the members and parents worked so hard raking and hauling leaves and branches along with cleaning inside the main lodge.

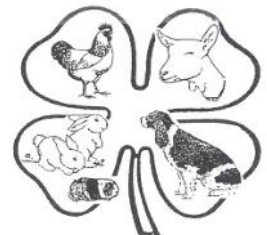
There are a few things to take note of:

- There is a separate form for the Cloverbud craft section. Cloverbuds are not allowed to sell in the Still Exhibit Auction.
- You will get an email following your sign up, to the email that you used to sign up. If you do NOT receive an email within 24 hours of your sign up, contact Kapre at kaprefilhart@ymail.com to make sure that your sign up went through. ALL sign ups are due June 9 by 10:00 p.m.
- You will need to know which project you plan to sell for the Still Exhibit Auction upon signing up (craft sign up AND auction form is due on June 9!). There is a second section under each department that will allow you to indicate whether or not you wish to sell a project from that section. You are still only allowed to sell ONE item for Still Exhibit auction.

Small Animal News

- Goats that will be entered in the small animal auction at the fair MUST have a scrapie tag BEFORE weigh-in. It is a State mandate, and if your auction goat does not have a scrapie tag, you will not be allowed to sell. ALL goats must have some identification -- either the scrapie tag or a tattoo for those not in the auction. Goat weigh-in (for wethers only) is May 13 from 10 a.m. - 12 p.m. in the small animal barn at the fairgrounds.

All sessions are 6:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m. in/around/near the Small Animal Barn at the fairgrounds. Rabbit members need to attend at least the June 26 or July 9 for fair class verification. It is critical because that is how we determine what/how many cages need to be set up. We also encourage all small animal species be in attendance at one of the earlier dates to ensure there aren't any issues with any of the animals. By doing so, the superintendents can work with the member to ensure the best plan to fix whatever problem may be found.

*****Clinics will be cancelled if temperatures reach 85 degrees or higher, it is a good idea to plan to attend the earliest available date.***

4-H Shooting Sports Age Policies:

- 4-H Shooting Sports Programs are open to young people aged 8 through 19. The “4-H age” will be determined by a young person’s age as of January 1 of the 4-H program year.
- 4-H members age 8 may participate in BB gun and basic archery training. Participation is at the discretion of the Certified Instructor and the participant must be under direct adult supervision (one on one).
- Cloverbuds (4-H ages 5 - 7) must wait until they reach the 4-H age of 8 to participate in shooting sports.
- Members ages 9 – 11 are limited to shooting Air Pellet, BB & archery at competitive events
- Youth must attend one qualifying shoot in order to compete at the county shoot

Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2023-24 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2023-2024 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs, as well as recognize members of the 4-H community. **All applications are due June 1.**

Opportunities include:

- ° **Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000.** These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that is making a difference.
- ° **4-H On-Target Grants of \$500.** These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- ° **The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$500.** This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.
- ° **4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000.** These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
- ° **Michigan Farm Bureau 4-H Excellence in Agriculture Award (includes \$1,000 grant).** This award recognizes outstanding 4-H agricultural volunteers that have exhibited excellence in 4-H youth education and leadership development.

Tips for purchasing and bringing home livestock

Acquiring new stock is exciting whether you are building your herd or flock or purchasing your annual 4-H project. These tips will help manage their health and safety by making sure you know what to ask before purchasing and how to prepare to bring livestock home.

Assessing Animal Health and Treatment Documentation

When purchasing animals, you should know their history. Ask the following questions:

- When was the animal born?
- What specific vaccinations has the animal been given and when were they given?
- If necessary, was the animal properly castrated and what method was used?
- Have any other treatments been administered to the animal? If so, what is the slaughter withdrawal for the drugs given?
- Have any of the animals on the farm been ill or shown symptoms of illness?
- If acquiring a market animal, what is the approximate weight?

Considerations as You Bring Animals Home

Transporting. Secure a trailer. If you do not own a trailer, make arrangements with someone who can transport animals for you. Be prepared to pay someone to provide transportation, as a courtesy.

Unloading. Make sure that your facility is ready to house your new animals before they arrive. Have a pen identified for new animals to go into with fresh water and appropriate feed. (Feed should be similar to their previous diet; changing to a new diet should be done over a period of time.) Have a clear and direct path to the animals' new pen from the trailer. Make sure that all gates are open or closed, as appropriate, and secured.

Settling in. Quarantine, or separate, new animals for a minimum of 21 days. At minimum, try to avoid nose-to-nose contact, and comingling feeding and watering. Minimize stress on new animals during the quarantine period. If after 21 days, the newly acquired animals have not shown any symptoms of illness, it should be safe to comingling them into your existing herd or flock.

Comingling. Since each species has a social hierarchy, observe animals during comingling and separate if there is risk of injury. Over the course of a day, the herd or flock should settle into a routine that includes the new animals.

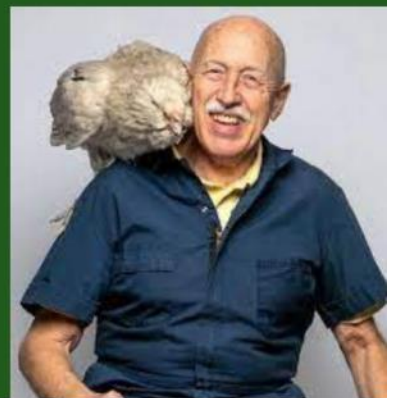

Proud Equestrian Program

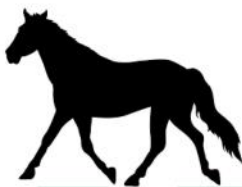
