## **YQCA** Certification

Youth ages 8-19 showing MARKET animals (Beef, Sheep, Swine, Poultry, Rabbits) are <u>required to complete</u> <u>YQCA training no later than June 15, 2023</u> to be eligible to show at the Monroe County Fair.

YQCA 2 Completion Options:

1. \$3.00 Instructor Led/ in-person training ages 8 to 18

Go to <u>http://yqcaprogram.org</u>. If you created an account last year, log into your account, select a child, select the age and instructor led training. Search Michigan and select the training you wish to register for (Monroe County Instructor led YQCA training). If you are new to YQCA, you will need to first create an account in YQCA. Monroe County has three dates available all held at the 4-H Activity Center.

Youth must register online at least two days prior to the selected training. Trainings are on a first come, first serve basis until full. No walk-ins will be accepted on site. All payments must be made in advance through the YQCA website. Youth must complete the pre-test prior to attending the class and then the post- test after the training.

**2.** \$12.00 <u>Web based training</u> Go to <u>https://yqcaprogram.org/</u> and log in using the account you created last year, if you are new to YQCA you will need to create an account. After logging in, you will need to select the correct YQCA class depending on age.

Youth can complete the course online each module takes 15-20 minutes with there is a total of five (5) modules.



The Monroe County Fair will be here before you know it. Now is the time to start thinking about purchasing your small animals. We will be taking orders for ducks and broilers for the next 2-3 months. The 4-H Small Animal requires the purchase of these two categories through the Small Animal Association to compete at the Monroe County Fair.

Market ducks must be ordered by May 1<sup>st</sup> at a cost of \$4.00 each.

Broiler chickens must be ordered by May 3<sup>rd</sup> at a cost of \$2.50 each.

## Register today for Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience!

At Michigan 4-H Capitol Experience, teens learn how to change the world for the better through engagement in Michigan's state government and public policy process. The 4-H Capitol Experience program, scheduled for March 12-14, in Lansing, has been described by past participants as "amazing", "life-changing", and "an opportunity unlike any other".

The three-day event, open to high-school-aged youth, includes tours of the Michigan Capitol, interactions with state legislators, meetings with state agency staff, lobbyists and state-level experts and learning how policy is made. During the program, youth work in small teams to draft legislation on agriculture, civil rights, education, energy, environment and natural resources, health or law enforcement and corrections.

The cost to register in 2023 is \$365, which includes meals, material fees and lodging at the Radisson Hotel in downtown Lansing. Please contact your local 4-H program coordinator to inquire about local funding opportunities. Scholarships may also be available through your local Farm Bureau office.

## World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute registrations due March 15!

As millions across the globe deal with food insecurity, the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute (WFP MIYI) offers young people an opportunity to be part of the solution. Held May 11 in East Lansing, or by participating from anywhere

else using Zoom video/web conference technology, the event seeks to inspire and prepare the next generation of global leaders to end world hunger.

Attendees will have the opportunity to share their ideas related to global food security with experts and other Michigan youth while learning how university faculty and staff members, researchers and students are working to address world hunger.

To participate, youth should be in grades 7-12 and register by the March 15 deadline. As part of the registration process, youth are required to prepare a two- to five-page research paper about a developing country and one of 20 key factors that affect food security. At the event, youth present and discuss their papers with other attendees and research and industry experts. They also participate in interactive activities related to global food challenges and engage with area experts to discuss solutions to global hunger and poverty.

The top performing students at the WFP MIYI will be selected to attend the World Food Prize Global Youth Institute in Des Moines, Iowa, in October. For more information, visit <u>https://www.canr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/</u>. Registrations and papers are due **March 15**.
