

#### **YQCA Certification**

Youth ages 8-19 showing MARKET animals (Beef, Sheep, Swine, Poultry, Rabbits) are required to complete YQCA training no later than June 15, 2024 to be eligible to show at the Monroe County Fair.

### **YQCA two Completion Options:**

1. \$3.00 Instructor Led/in-person training ages 8 to 18

Go to <u>YQCA - Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (yqcaprogram.org)</u>. If you created an account last year, log into your account, select a child, select the age and instructor led training. Search Michigan and select the training you wish to register for (Monroe County Instructor led YQCA training). If you are new to YQCA, you will need to first create an account in YQCA. Monroe County instructor led training to be held at the 4-H Activity Center on

Trainings are on a first come, first serve basis until full. No walk-ins will be accepted on site. All payments must be made in advance through the YQCA website. Youth must complete the pre-test prior to attending the class and then the post- test after the training.

#### <u>OR</u>

**2.** \$12.00 **Web based training** Go to <u>YQCA - Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (yqcaprogram.org)</u> and log in using the account you created last year, if you are new to YQCA you will need to create an account.

After logging in, you will need to select the correct YQCA class depending on age.

Youth can complete the course online each module takes 15-20 minutes with there is a total of five (5) modules.

\*19 year olds must take online course





### \$2,000 MSU PRE-COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP



MONROE COUNTY 4-H TEEN AWARDED \$2,000 MSU PRE-COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

SAMANTHA PRITULA, in 9<sup>th</sup> grade has been awarded a \$2,000 Michigan State University Pre-College Achievement Scholarship. Students in 8<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> grades for 2022-23 who attended an MSU summer pre-college program last year were eligible to apply for this award. SAMANTHA PRITULA participated in Vet Science Camp, one of four pre-college programs offered by MSU Extension 4-H Youth Development.

MSU pre-college programs are great for helping youth explore possible career interests. They are great fun, very educational, and help connect young people with university faculty and other resources. MSU pre-college programs also help youth envision their future so they can wisely choose their high school classes and prepare for college.

Selection for this scholarship is based on application and student essay. The scholarship is applied toward the student's first year at MSU as a degree-seeking student.

The pre-college programs annually offered by MSU Extension 4-H Youth Development are: 4-H Capitol Experience, 4-H Exploration Days, 4-H Great Lakes & Natural Resources Camp, and 4-H Animal & Veterinary Science Camp.
