#### **Pre-College Programs 4-H SPIN Club**



MSU-Extension has been working on finding ways to prepare young people for 4-H Pre-College programs. Our goal is to help young people get the most out of their 4-H experience and fill their toolbox for the future. Two of our Extension Educators have created a resource called "Introduction to Pre-College Programs 4-H SPIN Club Guide." They are looking for youth to pilot it starting this spring. The pilot will run through the fall to allow you to choose the time frame that works best for individual participants.

This guide provides information on all the 4-H pre-college programs we offer, and each week is structured to introduce a step that helps in preparation for the program of their choice.

#### Join the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase!

MSU Extension is thrilled to partner again in 2023 with the <u>Michigan State Fair</u> on an exciting program for Michigan youth: the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase. This statewide showcase provides a virtual platform for youth across Michigan to exhibit their work in all project areas and apply for up to \$10,000 in scholarships. Any Michigan youth ages 5-19 is encouraged to participate; 4-H membership is not required.

Registration for this event is now open! The diverse array of <u>classes</u> celebrate all the projects and programs in which youth have developed skill and mastery. This includes livestock and animal showmanship classes, as well as still exhibits, educational projects and more.



There is no cost to participate and youth may engage in as many classes as they wish by <u>submitting project photos and videos</u>. **Be sure to submit your entries by the registration deadline of August 1.** Project evaluation will occur before the start of the Michigan State Fair so that winners can be announced at the event which occurs August 31 – September 4.

In addition to the opportunity to showcase their skills, recognize their accomplishments and receive constructive feedback for growth and development, participants in the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase will also have the opportunity to apply for \$10,000 in scholarships. #### Going home: Biosecurity tips for animals that went to the county fair

Michigan State University Extension offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home after the fair has ended.

- Keep animals that were at the fair separate from animals that were not for 28 30 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that was at the fair.
- Throw away any feed or hay that was at the fair.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- · Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
  - Obvious pain or discomfort
  - Decrease in appetite and water intake
  - Fever
  - Lethargy
  - Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure
  - Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes
  - Overall weakness

Care of animals after the fair is just as critical as their before-fair care. Exhibited animals were exposed to new animal populations and fair goers, and most likely experienced a lot of stress during their time away from the farm. By practicing these biosecurity steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.



#### **GENERAL INFORMATION: (PLEASE SEE EVENT REGISTRATION FOR FULL RULES)**

- 1. Equipment: Contestants will supply their own equipment.
  - a. Mandatory equipment: Hip Quivers and an Arm Guard (must be worn on the contestant's bow arm (forearm) below the elbow.
  - b. Bows must have a 50-pound draw, or less.
  - c. Archers should have at least 9 arrows with archer's initials on them.
  - d. Bows shall be cased while on grounds.
  - e. Before the event, all equipment shall be inspected by Range Officer(s) or line judge.
- 2. Competition for all divisions will be as follows:
  - a. 10 ends of 6 arrows @ 3 minutes per end.
  - b. One practice end before scoring begins.
  - c. Awards for 1st, 2nd & 3rd place per age bracket and division will be presented following the completion of the tournament.
- 3. All competitors must stay in the roped off area during archery competition.
- 4. Always walk in the archery range. Horse play, abusive or foul language, and unsportsman-like conduct are not appropriate and will not be tolerated.
- 5. Archers will follow all whistle commands:
  - a. Two Blasts Archers to the shooting line. (Arrow must stay in quiver until next command.)
  - b. One Blast Begin shooting.
  - c. Three Blasts Walk forward and retrieve your arrows.
  - d. Four+ Blasts (series of blasts) STOP SHOOTING immediately; put your arrows in quiver.
- 6. Only those people shooting are allowed on the line. Spectators shall remain in the stands.
- 7. After each end is shot, archers will take bows back to the bow rack until the next end is ready to shoot.
- 8. Arrows or targets must not be touched until all arrows in target have been scored.
- 9. Archers will not score their own target during the competition. If there is a discrepancy in score, a line judge will determine score. After all arrows are scored, archers may pull their arrow.
- 10. After registration, participants will be assigned a start time and sent a confirmation email.


