Remember to review the fairbook to ensure you have everything that you need, and that the information that is in there makes sense for your species. If you have any questions pertaining to the verbiage in the fairbook or about a project area, email Sunni at haglun10@msu.edu.

Club Leaders need to:

- Submit their concession and Ash Building choices to Sunni and Vicki by June 10th (<u>haglun10@msu.edu</u> and <u>newcombv@msu.edu</u>)
- Ensure their club members are all ready for fair, they know what timelines they must meet, and their exhibits are all ready to go.
- Submit their pen counts to the <u>livestockcommittee76@gmail.com</u> email by the 7th of June.
- Ensure their club members who are showing market animals, have either completed their YQCA course, or will complete it on the 3rd or 4th of June. All certificates need to be mailed to the livestockcommittee76@gmail.com email by the 7th of June.

Fair reminders:

- Animal checks are done at 9am, 12pm, 3pm, 6pm and 9pm. If your animal is left without food, water or clean bedding during one of the checks, you will receive a warning. Upon the 2nd warning, you'll be issued a red flag and prohibited from showing that animal at fair the next year.
- Bring any equipment you need for cleaning out pens and food/water dishes. Some of these items may be rake, shovel, wheelbarrow, scrub brush, bucket, wagon, hose, etc. These items are not provided at the fairgrounds.
- Barn duty is assigned by club and barn. Please check with the superintendents of that area, to ensure your club doesn't miss their time slots.
- HAVE FUN and enjoy your time. This can be a stressful week, but it doesn't have to be.

Pre-College Programs 4-H SPIN Club

Two of our Extension Educators have created a resource called "Introduction to Pre-College Programs 4-H SPIN Club Guide." They are looking for youth to pilot it starting this spring. 



FAMILY SHOEBOX FLOAT RULES:

2023 THEME: "FAIRADISE"

- Families are encouraged to build at least one (no limit to how many)
- Floats are to be built for the narrow ends to represent the front and back of the floats.
- The 2023 Fair Theme above must be incorporated into the float.
- Float must be made of a cardboard shoebox no larger than 13"x 9"
- A complete decorated float should not exceed 16 1/2 inches tall.
- Do not put wheels on float. Do not put float on toy truck body.
- Do not put shoebox on a piece of cardboard larger than shoebox.
- Do not use motorized toys on float.
- Do not use anything edible on float.
- Do not build inside of the box (i.e., No diorama floats).
- Do not use a photo of the contestant or of political figures as a decoration.
- Please, no political statements, slogans, ideologies or references to such.
- Do not use inappropriate language or images on the float.

Samples of Materials: Paper mâché, cloth, foil, fringe, petal paper, etc. Most craft stores have a wide variety of things you can use. Let your imagination soar!

Junior (5-9)

Intermediate (10-13)

Senior (14-19)

Judging Criteria:

Originality (30%) Neatness (15%) Craftsmanship (20%) Use of Materials (20%) and Overall Appearance (15%)


