

Client Information


- ▶ The Tri-County Regional Planning Commission

 - Contracted MSU Urban & Regional Planning Practicum Students to help implement through an online toolkit.





What is Green Infrastructure


- ▶ Green Infrastructure is an interconnected network of green space and other environmental assets that conserves the functions of the natural ecosystem and provides associated benefits to people.




