Re: 2024 Goat Project Important Information

This is a quick update on the events that will take place for the 2024 fair season within the goat department. Should you have questions, please feel free to contact the MSU Extension Office at 269-467-5511. Please note that the information contained in this letter is subject to change.

NEW for 2024:

- We have added a Market Goat County Bred & Born class! Goats must be both bred and born in St. Joseph County. County Bred & Born forms must be filled out at countywide registration in June. Exhibitors may only show one animal in this class.
- Market and carcass goats MUST HAVE milk teeth present at time of fair weigh-in. Animals without milk teeth are ineligible for market/carcass exhibition at the fair and will be sent home at weigh-in. We recommend market/carcass goats be born by December 1, 2023 or after.
 - Exception: does may be exhibited as breeding stock if the member chooses.

Reminders:

Dairy goats and meat goats will show in separate rings with separate judges. Both rings will run the same show order: 4-H exhibitor meeting (all together), Showmanship (oldest to youngest), Cloverbuds, Market Classes, Breeding Classes, Home Born & Raised, County Bred & Born, Pet Class.

Market Goats

- Dairy Market Goat project animals are limited to the following breeds: Alpine, LaMancha, Nubian, Nigerian Dwarf, Oberhasli, Saanen, and Toggenberg.
- Meat Goats are any goat that is not included above. Example: Boer, Angora, Fainting, etc. or crossbred with a dairy breed.
- Every market goat must weigh a minimum of 60 lbs. at time of weigh-in on Saturday, September 14, 2024. Underweight animals are ineligible for exhibition at the fair and will be sent home at weigh-in. Exception: does may be exhibited as breeding stock if the member chooses.
- To compete in the 4-H Carcass Goat class, the goat must weigh a minimum of 60 lbs. More information to come about the Carcass Contest.
- Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) requires all goats that are moved off the farm for sale or exhibition to be **ear tagged** with a USDA Scrapies ID tag. Earless goats must have a collared tag. **Anyone purchasing goats should make sure the seller has tagged them prior to sale.** If you raise goats from your own herd you should contact the MDARD at 1-800-292-3939 to get a premises identification number. Once you have the premises number call the USDA at 1-866-873-2824 to get your tags.
- All 4-H livestock members/clubs will be held responsible for setting up their project pen/stall and decorations before fair, as well as cleaning and tearing down their project pen/stall at the end of fair. Individuals or clubs may be assessed a \$50.00 fine for failure to do so.

Initial weigh-in, tagging and registration	Tuesday, June 4, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m. or Thursday, June 6, 5:00 - 7:00 p.m.	 Weigh in will be at the east end of the Goat Barn at the Fairgrounds. Animals must have their USDA scrapies ID tag in the ear or on a collar if the animal does not have ears. Only the scrapies ID tag and the 4-H neck ID tag are allowed on the animal. Each member may tag up to 3 goats but may only show 2 market goats at fair. Family tagging is allowed.
