

## Calhoun County Field Crop Fall Meeting





Demonstration plots in LibertyLink soybeans showing the efficacy of various herbicide programs at different price points will be highlighted. Attendees will tour the weed control plots, and photos of two other fields in the demonstration—one LibertyLink and one Xtend—will also be shared. MSU Extension nematode specialist Marisol Quintanilla and regional field crop educators will be presenting on various topics to help you prepare for fall—see agenda on the back.
