Levels I & II:

- Level I 20 specimens.
- Level II 40 specimens total (20 from Level I and 20 new specimens).
- Your 3-ring notebook must include the following information for each specimen:
 - o Is this specimen a rock, mineral, or fossil?
 - O Where did you find this specimen?
 - Is this specimen igneous, metamorphic, or sedimentary? How did you determine this?
 - A photograph or colored sketch of the specimen.
- Other information you may want to include (but is not required):
 - Is this specimen used for anything? (Natural resource)
 - luster
 - o If you completed any of the following tests, you can include your results:
 - Hardness
 - > Streak
 - Any other interesting information you learned/discovered about your specimen.

Level III

 Collection of samples of raw minerals, plus report on product(s) produced from each mineral. Exhibit to include study of at least six different minerals.

Advanced

• Collection of samples of raw Michigan minerals, plus report on what has been learned about the uses and importance of each to Michigan's economy.
