## Congratulations to the 2017 Michigan 4-H Mark of Excellence Award Winners

Every year, counties across Michigan offer 4-H youth ages 11 and 12 the opportunity to participate in Michigan 4-H State Awards' 4-H Mark of Excellence essay contest. As part of the contest, Michigan State University (MSU) Extension staff members select up to two youth essays from each county to be recognized as award winners.

The essay theme for 2017 was "Because of 4-H, I can..." and the youth referred to their 4-H experiences as ones that have allowed them to make new friends, try new projects, explore new places and help their dreams come true. ### It's enrollment time!

Beginning Sept. 1, 2017, the Michigan 4-H participation fee will be \$20 per youth, with a maximum of \$60.00 per family. (September 1 2017– August 31, 2018)

E Families with three or more children in 4-H will not pay over \$60 in annual participation fees.

I Michigan 4-H does not collect participation fees for parents or volunteers.
For the cost of \$20: Michigan 4-H'ers have access to a number of opportunities and benefits that include

A full year of youth development programs including county, district, state, national, and international opportunities. Youth can participate in as many clubs and project areas as they choose for the same low cost.

Access 4-H events including 4-H Day at the Breslin, 4-H Exploration Days, 4-H Capitol Experience, National 4-H Congress, Citizenship Washington Focus, state 4-H animal shows/expos, Kettunen Center workshops and more.

Discounted registration rate for many local camps and statewide programs, including Thumb Area Camp, 4H Animal and Veterinary Science Camp, 4-H Great Lakes Natural Resource Camp, 4-H Renewable Energy Camp and other pre-college programs.

Access to various 4-H scholarships and award opportunities throughout the state, including six \$10,000 scholarships given annually to 4-H alums attending MSU.

I Supplemental accident insurance coverage provided by American Income Life for all 4-H youth andvolunteers enrolled in 4HOnline across the state of Michigan

I Volunteers who support positive youth development, that have been screened and background checked to ensure a safe environment for all youth participants

Participation fees will not be a barrier to youth/families for whom the fee is a financial burden. 4-H will not turn away any youth who wants to participate in 4-H. Scholarship grants are available to families unable to pay the increased fee. Please contact the office at 810-244-8500 for more information. This is the first increase in participation fee costs in more than 10 years and reflects the resources needed to support growth and expansion of Michigan's 4-H program and to provide additional resources that will benefit all of the state's 4-H'ers. As always, a portion of the participation fee will remain in the county to support local efforts and the remainder will be managed by the MSU Extension State 4-H Office. State office funds will be used to continue the support of the 4-H participation fee grant program (which funds various county and state 4-H programs across Michigan), the purchase of American Income Life supplemental accident insurance for all 4-H youth and volunteers enrolled in 4HOnline, resources for centralized and more rigorous Volunteer Selection Process (VSP) background checks, and more. These new and enhanced statewide resources will not only provide county 4-H staff with time savings – allowing us to redirect those resources to other local 4-H efforts – but will provide parents with an added level of safety and security when their child is engaging in 4-H programs. As in the past, 4-H members and/or their family may be responsible for additional fees for individual projects, club dues, event registrations, or fair.

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
