<u>Wednesday, Feb. 28</u> – Registration, cover design and club display space deadline <u>Friday, March 16</u> – 4-H club setup and early absentee projects, 4-7 p.m. (Clubs can also set up on Saturday morning starting at 8:30 a.m.)

GENERAL INFORMATION

PROGRAM COVER DESIGN CONTEST: Requirements – BLACK PEN, on an 8½ x 11 white paper. Design must be 4-H-related, event name (4-H Spring Achievement/Style Revue), date (March 17, 2018), program time (3:30 p.m.), and 4-H clover. Deadline: Feb. 28. No computer created designs. Put your name on the back. Entries may be used for publicity. \$20 awarded to first place; \$10 to second place.

<u>REGISTRATION:</u> Registrations due Feb. 28th. <u>NO LATE REGISTRATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED</u>. An accurate count of the projects is needed by Feb. 28th so scheduling of the judges can be completed. Members, put all projects on one entry form.

<u>CLUBS MUST RESERVE DISPLAY SPACE.</u> Please provide club representative(s) to supervise display area and get absentee projects to judges. Please contact the office if your plans change and you can't come. CLUBS are encouraged to decorate your table display area. Leaders, if you won't have a club display, please let members know they can still enter projects. Let us know if your club will have individual entries so that we have enough display space. All individual entries with no club displays will be grouped together. If able to bring your own table and chairs, please call the office and let us know how many you will be bringing.

ENTRY TAGS – Each project needs an entry tag. They may be picked up in the office.

ABSENTEE FORMS must be attached to projects when member cannot be present for judging. They are to be kept at <u>CLUB DISPLAY</u>, and <u>CLUB REPRESENTATIVE(S)</u> is/are responsible for getting projects and forms to judges. Pick up the forms in the office. Club representative(s), please see that no absentee projects are left at hall. 4-H staff cannot be responsible for projects. Thank you.

<u>CLOVER BUDS</u> (under 9, 4-H age, as of Jan. 1) will be interviewed separately to ensure personal attention and encouragement. They will receive participation ribbons. Please take only 4 projects to a judge at a time. If you have more than 4 projects, take the others to another judge. This reduces wait time for the Clover Buds.

PUBLIC SPEAKING, DEMONSTRATIONS & PERFORMING ARTS: Judging times will be from 9:30 am – 12:00 pm and 1:00 – 3:30 pm. The specific schedule will be determined by the number of entries. All entrants will be contacted prior to the event and given appointment times for judging. Must include current phone numbers and entry descriptions on your registration form so the coordinator can contact you. Times: Maximum 5 minutes for individual entries and 10 minutes for group entries. Must furnish own props, instruments, stands, tape/cd player, etc.

FOOD: None for sale on site; restaurants in village of North Branch or you can bring your own lunch.

PUBLIC OPEN HOUSE – 10:00– 3:00 P.M. – public welcome to view displays and get information about 4-H.

Also welcome to attend closing ceremony.

<u>CLOSING CEREMONIES</u> 3:30 – 4:30 p.m. Style Show, county awards and medals, and club recognition. Every club will be invited to introduce themselves.

Projects released immediately after the closing program. Clubs must clean display areas before leaving.

You will still model in the closing ceremonies. Bring 1 typed copy 4"x 6" narration card and give them to the judge. Cloverbuds & young: 25-30 words, Jr & Sr: 50-60 words.
