Back to weed management

Sassafras

Sassafras albidum

Life cycle: Small to large colony forming trees.

Leaves: Leaves may have no lobes, one (mitten shaped) or two lobes. From 2 to 4 inches wide and 4 to 10 inches long. Develop an attractive yellow to red fall color.

Stems: Young twigs and new shoots have smooth green to brown bark.

Flowers and fruit: Small, hanging flowers and blue fruit.

Reproduction: Plants spread laterally from underground stems that produce shoots. Single plants can develop into large patches if not controlled.

Similar weeds

Although numerous tree seedlings can infest blueberry patches, the three distinct leaf shapes of sassafras are distinguishing.
