Sessions take place on:

- Thursday, June 22 from 8:30am-11:30am (3 hour session- Session A)
- Thursday, June 22 from 1:30pm-4:30pm (3 hour session- Session B)
- Thursday, June 22 from 8:30am-11:30am AND 1:30pm-4:30pm (6 hour session- Session C)
- Friday, June 23 from 8:30am-11:00am (2 1/2 hour session-Session D)

Please note-field trips off campus are only available for sessions held on Thursday (Session C) due to timing. Busing to an on-campus is available for all sessions.

Think outside the box for session ideas! Youth like sessions on career paths, cutting edge research/work, animals, life skills for their future, recreational activities and new and emerging activities/topics.

A few key points to know:

- Thursday sessions (A and B) are 3 hours long; Friday morning (D session) is only 2.5 hours long to allow travel time for participants back home
- Content should be interactive and fill the full time slot chosen

- A second survey for accepted sessions will come out closer to the event to determine session supply and lodging needs
- Please complete the survey again if submitting a different session idea
- We will be providing a training for all instructors to provide framing around the event outcomes and best practices for session success
- Instructors will be provided meals for the days that they are teaching a session. If lodging is needed, the cost will be \$60 for one night and \$120 for two nights to cover basic costs of the event (please notify us at <u>4h.expodays@msu.edu</u> or contact Laurie Rivetto directly at <u>rivettoL@msu.edu</u> if this is a significant barrier)

Please note a session submission does not equate to a session at the event. All sessions will not be accepted due to need, size of sessions, and spacing availability. Notification will be sent by early 2023 regarding acceptance.
