# Undergraduate Awards & Scholarships

The Department of Agriculture, Food and Resource Economics undergraduate awards annually between \$70,000 to \$85,000 per year. The awards and scholarships are highly competitive and typically go to students who are academically strong, active in the department, and engaged within the profession.

To be considered for a scholarship, students must apply annually. A call for scholarship applications will be e-mailed to students in the Spring semester. \*Note scholarships available to admitted Freshman students.
