

DESCRIPTION:

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 7 to 21. YQCA is designed as an annual education and certification program focused on food safety, animal well-being and character awareness.



WHO SHOULD ATTEND:

Any Youth exhibiting any Market animals must be certified per current YQCA Standards and a copy of the certificate must be turned into Youth Livestock Secretary before July 1 of current year.

YQCA Group Breakdown:

- 8-18 years old- must complete the pre-test prior to attending an inperson class.
- 19 years old- Must complete YQCA online.

All certifications must be valid through the last day of the Allegan Fair.

Youth must register online at least two days prior to the selected workshop. Workshops are on a first come, first serve basis until full. No walk-ins will be accepted on site. All payments must be made in advance through the YQCA website. Youth must complete the pre-test prior to attending the class.

YQCA In-Person Certification:

Youth Quality Care Assurance certification can be completed in-person. However, please note the following details:

Cost: \$3.00

Who: Open to youth exhibitors ages 8-18 years of age.

Time: 60-80 minutes

Certification Expiration: Certification is good one (1) year from the date of passing

exam.

How to register for online trainings: Go to http://yqcaprogram.org. If you created an account last year, log into your account, select a child, select the age and instructor led training. Search Michigan and select the training you wish to register for. If you are new to YQCA, you will need to first create an account in YQCA. Youth must complete the pretest prior to attending the class.

YQCA Online Certification:

Youth Quality Care Assurance certification can be completed online as well. However, please note the following details:

Cost: \$12.00

Who: Open to youth exhibitors ages 8-19 years of age.

Time: Youth can complete the course at their convenience online at any point. Each module takes 15-20 minutes with there be a total of five (5) modules.

takes 13-20 minutes with there be a total of live (3) modules.

Certification Expiration: Certification is good one (1) year from the date of passing exam.

How to register for online trainings: Go to https://yqcaprogram.org/ and log in using the account you created last year. If you are new to YQCA you will need to create an account. After logging in, you will need to select the correct YQCA class depending on age.

YQCA Online Test Out Option:

YQCA is offering a test-out option that consists of 50 questions. Youth must receive a passing score of at least 80% to receive certification through this option. Youth will only be given one chance to pass. Failure to receive a passing score will result in youth having to take the certification course either online or in-person.

Cost: \$36.00-\$48.00

Who: 12, 15, and 19 years old

Certification Expiration: Certification is good for three (3) or four (4) years from date of passing depending on age

How to register online: Go to http://yqcaprogram.org and log in or create an account. If you do not have an account. After logging in, you will need to select the correct YQCA class depending on age.

Apply for the Michigan 4-H State Awards!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards



(13-19 years old). The application process and selection is determined by the age of the 4-H member.
