Rules:

- Members may tag up to 2 animals (steers or heifers), but may only bring 1 animal. Tag sheets completed and turned in to MSU Extension Office by February 15th. Holstein steers may be used. All animals must have an ear tag corresponding to tag numbers turned into MSU Extension Office.
- 2. Youth must confirm with Tina Klingenberg by the <u>July 15th</u>, 4-H Livestock Leaders Meeting their intention of participating. After this date if an animal becomes sick or dies the youth should notify the office immediately. *This show is limited to the first 18 exhibitors confirmed on July 15th*.
- 3. Youth participating in this Beef Carcass show must also show a species of large livestock at the Allegan County Fair.
- 4. Calves are not required to be clipped or trained to lead, nor be Bovine TB tested, <u>however calves</u> <u>must have an official Michigan RFID tag and an official Allegan County 4-H Beef tag in their</u> <u>ear.</u>
- 5. All participants must be actively present at both the Live Judging and Carcass Judging. Members not actively present will be placed at the bottom of the judging and will not receive any premiums.
- 6. All calves will be judged 100% on hanging carcass. Premiums will be on a graduated scale.
- 7. Animals cannot sell at auction, Grand & Reserve Beef Carcass will be sold at the 4-H Livestock Auction during the Fair. Byron Center Meats will donate the processing for the Grand Champion Carcass. Reserve Champion carcass processing will be paid by 4-H Livestock Leaders. All other participates are responsible for their processing cost.
