RESEARCH

Research focuses on:

- Sustainable development to ensure that our future built environments are created with sustainability and in harmony with the natural environment while maintaining social equity and economic vitality.
- Specific subjects include affordable housing, domicology, lowimpact development, sustainable construction materials and methods, urban resiliency and urban redevelopment.
- How built environments affect people's behavior and thus the health outcomes address topics such as active living, bikeability and walkability, obesity resulting from poorly developed built environments, and better built environment to accommodate an aging population and people with disabilities.
- Research on developing multimodal transportation that is harmonic with the built environment to protect and preserve natural resources investigates how the built environment should be shaped or reshaped to accommodate various modes of transportation such as pedestrian, bicycle, scooter, car, etc.
 Specific subjects include autonomous vehicles (future), active transportation, multimodal transportation, complete streets, etc.

OUTREACH

Faculty historically work on a wide array of outreach and engagement programs within communities, with professional organizations, in concert with elected and appointed officials, and with the general public. Research underpins these outreach efforts, and students are active participants in these learning opportunities, which provide them with real-world experience. The National Charrette Institute, a training, outreach and research program within SPDC, helps people work together by building capacity for collaboration.
