- Dairy cows receive a controlled diet, and we ask that you please **do not** feed them any snacks (including grass from the ground).
- Please be alert and watch for moving vehicles.
- Please remember to wash your hands after petting any animals. We also recommend that you avoid eating or drinking around animal exhibit areas. Hand-washing areas and bathrooms are located at the office building at the northeastern corner of the farm.
- To help protect our animals, some of our areas are off limits to visitors. Please do not enter an area marked with a "Biosecurity Area, Please Do Not Enter" sign.
- To help ensure the biosecurity of our farm, we ask that you not approach, enter or tour our facility if you have been in a foreign country in the last seven days.
