Barry County 4-H Rabbit & Cavy Achievement Award Criteria for Judges

- 1. Judges work well with youth.
- 2. Judges will be 21 years old or older.
- 3. Judges will not judge their own Club or family members.
- 4. Judges will be chosen by the Developmental Committee, once the applications have been received.
- 5. Judges should be knowledgeable in both rabbits and cavies.
