Join as an Independent 4-H Member

Independent 4-H members participate in programs and events outside of a 4-H Club.

1) Enroll in <u>4-H Online</u>.

2) Select the Bay County 4-H Club *(non-affiliate) as your primary club. Stay connected to select the 4-H experience you want to join. Sign up when available.

Join a 4-H Spin Club – Camp – Event

1) Enroll in <u>4-H Online</u>.

2) Select the SPIN Club or Event you want to join. Events vary through the year.

Fore more than 100 years, 4-H has inspired families, shaped careers, and impacted communities. From October 1-7, we will celebrate the impact of 4-H during National 4-H Week. The theme of this year's National 4-H Week is "I \bigcirc O 4-H." As you plan ahead for how you will mark National 4-H Week in your community, here are some ideas of you can celebrate 4-H and show all the ways you \bigcirc O 4-H !

Wear Your 4-H Gear — Nothing says 4-H pride like a 4-H tee! Dress yourself (or the entire family – pets included!) in 4-H green and clover gear.

Shout-Out a 4-H'er — Recognize the hard work and dedication of 4-H'ers by shouting out one youth or an entire club on social media, in a local newspaper or other media.
