

Michigan 4-H In-Person Programming Update

Dear Michigan 4-H community,

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to shift and change, Michigan State University issued new guidance for the MSU community.



Beginning immediately, attendees at any indoor MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H program or event are required to wear a face covering. This includes 4-H meetings and other volunteer-led events. Unless they have a medical exemption, face coverings must be worn by everyone in attendance over age 2 regardless of vaccination status.

For the purpose of MSU Extension or Michigan 4-H events and programs, indoor events are considered those in an enclosed building with limited airflow. Barns and other outbuildings that have multiple doors that can be fully opened to maximize air flow are considered an outdoor, open air facility.

The health and wellbeing of MSU Extension participants, volunteers, professionals and their families remain of utmost importance. For this reason, volunteers and youth are reminded about additional best practices during the COVID-19 pandemic, including:

- \Rightarrow Posting signage about indoor mask requirements
- \Rightarrow Meeting outside when possible
- ⇒ Keeping participant numbers below maximum capacity to allow for social distancing
- \Rightarrow Offering hand sanitizer at touch points
- ⇒ Frequently sanitizing surfaces
- ⇒ Keeping a record of attendance with contact information for each in-person engagement, via meeting minutes, registration, attendance logs or other methods.

Like many of you, we were excited to resume face-to-face programming earlier this year and know this news may be disappointing to some. It is our hope that through mitigation steps such as these, we can work together to protect public health while continuing to meet in-person with our 4-H community.

Michigan 4-H eliminates 4-H participation fee

It is with great enthusiasm that MSU Extension has eliminated the 4-H participation fee beyond the current program year. The fee was not collected in 2020-2021 in consideration of the financial strain put on some families due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This pause gave the organization an opportunity to reflect on how it can best reach all audiences. Despite best efforts, this fee has been a barrier for some. By removing the fee indefinitely, MSU Extension feels it can best bring the power of 4-H to all young people in Michigan. MSU Extension 4-H program coordinators played a large role in leading MSU Extension through this decision. These professionals serve alongside youth across the state and have been champions for removing the participation fee in an effort to better reach underserved audiences in rural, urban and suburban communities.

It is important to note that enhancements previously supported by 4-H participation fee funds, including 4-H grants, awards and scholarships, and supplemental accidental insurance for 4-H youth and volunteers, will continue. Michigan 4-H has identified alternative funding sources that can support these and other local and state programing initiatives previously enhanced by participation fee dollars. This includes endowments, grants, reallocating funds formerly used for 4-H participation fee scholarships and other methods. The quality and quantity of programming offered by Michigan 4-H will not be diminished as a result of the participation fee dissolution.

The last 15 months have been difficult. MSU Extension is excited to once again offer faceto-face programs in local communities and hopes this new policy will provide the current and future 4-H community with new and improved opportunities to grow with 4-H.

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program took place in June 2021. While 4-H members were unable to gather at Michigan State University (MSU) as in past years, the Recognition Celebration was able to be held via a zoom webinar allowing 4-H members along with their family and friends to attend the program.



A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on Michigan 4-H members. The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is an opportunity for 4-H members to receive recognition while developing their leadership skills and personal portfolio. The program features a Junior and Senior division in 20 project areas as well as a group award category.

Our congratulations go out to Evie Clare who is one of this year's winners. Evie Clare resides in Sodus, Michigan. She joined a rabbit 4-H club at the age of five and became a member of the Great Expectations equine 4-H club when she was eight years old. She was an instant fan of showing animals, especially her horses. Over the years, she has shown several different horses that have all contributed to her growth as a showman. She has served as both vice president and president of Great Expectations horse 4-H club. She joined the Berrien County 4-H Horse Judging team in late 2017 and has been a team member ever since. "I Dare You" Award

The I Dare You Award recognizes youth that have been selected as the runner up to the Outstanding 4- H'er. Recipients are selected through submission for the Outstanding 4-H Award.

County Project Medals

The county project medals recognizes members within a project area that they have completed for at least three years. Youth are only able to receive one project medal in a project area in their 4-H career. This award is an application.

All—Achievement Award

Presented to members in recognition of their leadership and experience within a project area that they have completed for at least four years. This award is an application.

Outstanding 4-H Leader

The Outstanding 4-H Leader Award recognizes 4-H leaders for their volunteer service and leadership within their 4-H clubs as well as their leadership on county programs, committees, and activities that benefit the more than 500 youth and their families enrolled in Berrien County 4-H.

Clover Years of Service Awards

Presented to 4-H Leaders for achieving milestones for years of service.

Citizenship Award

This award is for all members and is nominated by the Club Coordinator. Given to individuals who foster leadership and enthusiasm amongst 4-H members.

1st Year Member Award

This is open to 4-H members ages 5—19 years that have just finished their first year. This award is nominated by the Club Coordinator.

Cloverbud Completion Certificate

Presented to all Cloverbuds transitioning to full- fledged 4-H members between the 4-H ages of 7 – 8. This award is nominated by the Club Coordinator.

2022 4-H Senior Award Cords Nominations Due October 1, 2021

Each year Berrien County 4-H Senior Awards are presented to Berrien County 4-H members who have been a member for five or more years and have plans to graduate from high school during the current 4-H year.

Why is taking attendance an important practice for 4-H clubs?

MSU Extension believes best practice for 4-H clubs is to take attendance at all meetings. Although Roberts Rules of Order, 12th edition doesn't talk about requiring attendance, it does share some reasons why attendance is important. In addition, there are many other benefits to clubs that provide support and strength in many ways. This includes:

- It allows members to feel a sense of value. Members will see that their attendance matters and they are noticed when they are at a meeting.
- It provides the members with a sense of belonging. Starting a meeting off with something as simple as attendance allows everyone to participate and have a voice.
- It holds people accountable.
- It allows leadership of the group to know who to share information with after the meeting. The leadership will be able to quickly see who was not able to attend and can reach out to them to keep everyone current on the club happenings.
- It helps leadership plan better for the future. They can see if certain meetings were less attended and consider changing the schedule.
- It can help leadership see if the meetings are relevant and on point. If many meetings are poorly attended, then changes might be in order for the group.
- It provides a record for meeting quorum. Taking attendance will allow the president to see if a quorum is actually present before proceeding with the meeting and will show proof of this after the minutes are placed on record.

The process for taking attendance can be done in many ways. It can be fun, quick or you can use it as a way to help youth connect or get more familiar with each other. The important part is to take the attendance prior to every meeting. The formal steps to taking attendance can be found in the resource, "Congratulations! You Are Secretary of Your 4-H Club."
