Purpose and Eligibility

The **purpose** of this handbook is to create an awareness of opportunities and awards offered to youth and adult volunteer leaders in the Berrien County 4-H Youth Program.

To be **eligible**, members must be actively enrolled in a 4-H club that is in good standing as verified by the Berrien County MSUE Office. This includes the club's enrollment records, financial statement, Civil Rights Statement, participation in annual fund-raiser, etc. Some awards only require a nomination from the member's club coordinator. Others require recommendations and an award application. Leaders and parents are encouraged to assume an active supporting role in helping 4-H members complete their applications, but the work and applications are to be completed by the member.

Adult volunteer leaders **must** have completed the MSU Extension Volunteer Selection Process and be in good standing as verified by the MSUE Office, excluding the MI Emerald Clover Society and National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Awards.

SELECTION PROCESS

First, the purpose of the award is made known, what it does, etc. Second, requirements to qualify for the award are made known- age, years of club work, etc. Third, the applicant's information is studied-does the information meet the purpose and is the member/leader qualified? Fourth, the awards committee may request to interview applicants.

The Berrien County 4-H Awards Selection Committee may include community partner involvement depending on the award. The Awards Committee may be composed of active project and resource leaders, club coordinators, teen leaders, and staff as advisors (when appropriate), which represent our diverse, overall, 4-H community. Adult volunteer leader recognition opportunities are selected differently for each award.

Outstanding 4-H Leader Award recipients are chosen by the Berrien County Outstanding 4-H
Leaders Committee which consists of past Outstanding 4-H Leaders.

- ☐ MI Emerald Clover Society nominees are submitted to the MI 4-H Foundation for selection of inductees.
- □ National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Award nominees are submitted to the MI 4-H Youth Development Office for state selection. State winners are forwarded for regional and national selection.

County Project Award

The County Project Award recognizes a member for completing at least 3 years in a project.

Criteria:

- 1. Member must be 12-19 years old as of January 1 of the current year.
- 2. Medals should be presented to members with at least 3 years of experience.
- 3. Have completed a project this year for the medal nominated, except for the achievement, leadership and citizenship medals, which have no specific project.
- 4. A member may be nominated for more than one medal but can receive a county medal only once for any project. A separate form must be completed for each project for which they are nominated. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than 2 medals in a year.

The All-Achievement Award recognizes a member's leadership and experience with a project that they have completed for at least four (4) years.

Criteria:

- 1. Member must be 16-19 years old as of January 1 of the current year.
- 2. A 4-H member will not be awarded more than two medals in a calendar year.
- 3. Medals should be presented to members with at least 4 years of experience in the project and must be participating in that project currently.
- 4. A 4-H member can only win a medal once in a project area during their 4-H career.

- 2. Must have been a member for at least six (6) years.
- 3. If necessary, the applicant maybe interviewed by the selection committee.

The Clover Years of Service Award recognizes 4-H Leaders for the dedication and years of service to the 4-H program every 5, 10, 15, etc. milestone is reached.

- 1. Award to 4-H Leaders reaching 1, 5, 10, 15, 20, 25 years and more of service.
- 2. Must have completed annual compliance and enrollment for the current year.

- 1. Club must have been registered with the MSU Extension Office for a minimum of five (5) years including the current year.
- 2. Application must be filled out by the Club Officers.
- 3. Club must provide a copy of a meeting agenda, minutes, and club highlights such as historian scrapbook.

MI 4-H Dog Patch Program

The Dog Patch Program is designed to recognize the personal achievements of individuals participation in the 4-H Dog Program. The program has been in existence since 1987 and provides youth with goals to work towards in this project area.

Criteria:

Youth should carry a qualifying Score Sheet and Judge Signature Sheet with them to all shows. When the individual wins a class, or earns a placing listed in the requirements for the patch they are working towards, they should be sure to get the judge's signature for that class and fill in the appropriate information about that placing. Once the participant has received all the signatures that are required for that patch and have completed all the requirements they need, they can submit to the local 4-H County office.
