Michigan 4-H members. The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is an opportunity for 4-H members to receive recognition while developing their leadership skills and personal portfolio. The program features a Junior and Senior division in 20 project areas as well as a group award category.

Throughout her 11 years in the 4-H program, she has been selected as treasurer and president for her club. Every year, counties across Michigan offer 4-H youth, ages 11 and 12, the opportunity to participate in Michigan 4-H State Awards' 4-H Mark of Excellence essay contest. The essay theme is "Because of 4-H, I can..." and the youth referred to a variety of memorable experiences in their time as 4-H'ers. As part of the contest, up to two 4-H youth essays from each country are selected to be recognized as award winners.

In 2020, 52 4-H members from 33 counties were selected as the 2020 Mark of Excellence county winners. This year Mason Green of the Backyard Renegades 4-H Club was selected to represent Berrien County.

Recipient received a medal, and their winning essays during the virtual State 4-H Award Celebration as well as were added to the Mark of Excellence history book at the Michigan 4-H Foundation and State 4-H Office at MSU Extension. In addition, Mason will be presented with

a certificate and a 4-H program scholarship in the amount of \$40.00 to continue his 4-H journey during the 2020 Berrien County 4-H Member & Leader Recognition Banquet in the Fall.

The Berrien County 4-H Horse Leaders Association would like to present a scholarship opportunity. The scholarship was created to encourage active participation in the Berrien County 4-H Equine Project. Horse ownerships and or equine related major/minor is not required for eligibility. Scholarship is awarded to at least two individuals for a minimum of \$500.00.



- Applicants must be a high school graduate and have been a member of the Berrien County 4-H Horse & Pony Project for a minimum of two years.
- Applicant must have completed their first year of college or trade school.
- Applicant may apply and be awarded the scholarship up to 3 times provided they have not reached their 21st birthday by January 1 of the application year. The scholarship will not apply for graduate school.
