

On November 21, 2020, in collaboration with Berrien County Farm Bureau, Farm Bureau Insurance Agent Charitable Fund and Southwest Michigan Collegiate Farm Bureau, local Berrien County 4-H Clubs came together to participate in the Thanks 4 Giving community service project. Clubs were asked to



provide items and assist in assembling baskets to give out to individuals and families in need throughout Berrien County during the Thanksgiving holiday.

This year, 110 baskets were assembled and distributed to families across Berrien County. Each bushel basket was overflowing with enough food for a family to enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving feast, including a turkey, locally grown lettuce, apples, potatoes, sweet potatoes, stuffing mix, canned vegetables, cranberry sauce, fresh baked dinner rolls, a pumpkin pie and vouchers for milk and butter from local grocery stores. Each basket contained at least 35 pounds of food and a total of 3,850 pounds of food was distributed! Basket items were sourced through local producers and business in Berrien County.

were many learning curves and bumps in the road, the 2020 4-H virtual showcase and auction season led to many successes and for that, we say THANK YOU. Here's a look back at the 2020 4-H virtual showcase and auction season:

- 58 counties offered a 4-H virtual showcase and/or auction for youth
- 17 virtual auctions were held
- 7,294 entries were submitted
- 2,699 youth participated
- 3,764 buyers/donors registered for virtual auctions
- \$1.4 million was spent by donors and buyers at 4-H virtual auctions
