## New Training Required for 4-H Leaders and Volunteers

Since 2013, Michigan State University (MSU) has required all MSU employees and volunteers conducting business on behalf of the university to report child abuse and other harm to children. To help MSU Extension volunteers better understand the reporting expectations, a new online learning module titled "Child Abuse Reporting Protocol" has been developed. The module can be completed in 10-15 minutes. All 4-H volunteers are required to complete this training by **December 31, 2022**.

To review the training, 4-H volunteers may:

- Log into Volunteer Central and complete the module through the system. Within Volunteer Central, the module will be visible on either the screening dashboard (applicants) or the annual compliance dashboard (volunteers). Once completed, Volunteer Central will log this as "completed".
- Check with your local 4-H program coordinator to determine if they will be hosting a local training or meeting to review and discuss the material. For trainings conducted by MSU Extension professionals, attendance will be recorded in Volunteer Central on your behalf.

Leaders only are required to take training one time.

## **Annual Compliance Process Update**

Beginning on July 1, MSU Extension changed the annual compliance process for all volunteers. Moving forward, a background check authorization will not be required beyond the initial authorization submitted at the time of application. Furthermore, background checks will be conducted during a volunteer's birth month. A courtesy email will be sent to the volunteer at least two weeks prior to the date of the background check. If a volunteer plans to remain active, no action is required until their Volunteer Code of Conduct is due. If the volunteer would like to resign or has already left the program, the volunteer can respond asking MSU Extension to change their activity status and not conduct the background check.

It is recommended that volunteers review and complete the Volunteer Code of Conduct and Media/Medical Waiver annually to ensure emergency medical information is up-to-date. On occasion, MSU Extension will make updates to the Volunteer Code of Conduct. When this happens, volunteers will be notified and provided with a timeframe in which they must login to <u>https://msu.samaritan.com/custom/502/volunteer login</u> and update their Volunteer Code of Conduct and Media/Medical Waiver.

## Chapin Returns as Director of Michigan State University Extension Children and Youth Initiatives

Michigan State University (MSU) Extension announced the appointment of Julie Chapin, Ph.D., as director of the MSU Extension Children and Youth Institute (CYI), the unit focused on programming for those from birth to age 19, including Michigan 4-H. Chapin reassumes the role after serving as the CYI director from 2010-2018.

"We are thrilled to have Dr. Chapin back at the helm of CYI," said Quentin Tyler, MSU Extension



director. "Julie's strong vision, leadership acumen and passion for the 4-H Youth Development program make her an ideal candidate to help increase and improve our children and youth programs."

Chapin has a long history with MSU Extension and Michigan 4-H that spans 36 years. A 4-H alumna from Ottawa County, Chapin began her professional career at MSU Extension in 1981 as a 4-H youth agent. She later became a youth animal science specialist before serving as state 4-H program leader for volunteer development. In 2010, Chapin became the first director of CYI when the institute was established, a role she served in until she retired in 2018. She has been honored for her Extension service with the Michigan and National Distinguished Service Awards.

"I'm so happy to be back working with the talented professionals that make up CYI and the amazing youth and families across our Michigan 4-H community," said Chapin. "The work being done across the state by our staff and volunteers is truly making a difference in the lives of children. I look forward to helping elevate and advance this work moving forward."

Chapin's appointment was effective June 1, 2022.

Going home: Biosecurity Tips for Animals that Went to

Michigan State University Extension offers these biosecurity steps exhibitors can take to protect their show animals and those that were left at home after the fair has ended.

- Keep animals that were at the fair separate from animals that were not for 28 30 days. If at all possible, do not allow nose-to-nose contact and provide as much distance between animals.
- Disinfect all buckets, feeders, tools and footwear that was at the fair.
- Throw away any feed or hay that was at the fair.
- Always wear clean clothes and footwear. Boot coverings may be helpful when caring for animals.
- Take care of animals that stayed home from the show first, and animals that were at the show second. Do not go back and forth between animals as this increases the risk of cross-contamination.
- Do not eat or drink in the barn.
- Observe animals daily for signs and symptoms of illness, such as:
- Obvious pain or discomfort
- Decrease in appetite and water intake
- Fever
- Lethargy
- Diarrhea or changes in consistency in manure
- Discharge from nasal cavity or eyes
- Overall weakness

If you notice any of the above symptoms, please call your veterinarian immediately.

Care of animals after the fair is just as critical as their before-fair care. Exhibited animals were exposed to new animal populations and fair goers, and most likely experienced a lot of stress during their time away from the farm. By practicing these biosecurity steps, you can help keep all of your animals safe and healthy.

## Participate in Michigan's World Food Prize Youth Institute

The Michigan Youth Institute is a life-changing experience coordinated by Michigan State University where high school students engage with local leaders and experts on critical global challenges, participate in hands-on activities, and explore exciting ways to make a difference in Michigan and around the world.

Students research issues they care about and propose their ideas to solve these grand challenges. To participate in the Michigan Youth Institute, students research a global issue and write a global challenge paper under the supervision of a teacher or mentor. A mentor can be a 4-H Leader/ Volunteer who works with youth who are interested in learning about global food security to complete the global challenge paper as a part of their 4-H experience.

Students who are in grades 7 through 12 during the 2022-2023 school year are eligible participate in the Michigan Youth Institute on May 11, 2023 at MSU Campus in East Lansing. Youth must register by submitting a three to five page paper by March 15, 2023.

### 2022 Michigan 4-H State Award Winners Announced



The <u>Michigan 4-H State Awards</u> Program recognized outstanding 4-H members during the opening session of 4-H Exploration Days on June 22. At the event, honorees had the opportunity to celebrate their accomplishments with their fellow 4-H Exploration Days participants.

A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on Michigan 4-H members and recognizes a level of excellence in learning, leadership and service. In total, 20 4-H members from 16 counties submitted applications to take part is this year's program.

"With tens of thousands of 4-H'ers across the state, the youth honored with 4-H State Awards are some of our most

accomplished 4-H'ers," said Julie Chapin, 4-H state leader of Michigan 4-H and director of MSU Extension's children and youth programs. "Their commitment to bettering themselves and their communities through service and extensive 4-H work make them true leaders in their clubs, counties and across our state." Michigan 4-H State Awards were presented in 13 of the 19 available award categories that showcase the diverse array of 4-H knowledge, skills, and experience. Recipients of the 2022 awards are:

The Michigan 4-H State Awards Program is open to 4-H members who are 13-19 years old with three or more years of 4-H experience. To qualify for the award, 4-H'ers must submit a written application that showcases the learning experiences, knowledge and skills they've acquired through their participation in 4-H, as well as their contributions to their local 4-H programs, clubs and communities. Submissions are reviewed by the Michigan 4-H State Awards selection committee. This group of volunteers, staff members and industry experts determine which members are selected as award finalists. All applicants receive written feedback from selection committees.

Senior delegates (ages 16-19) and groups then complete an interview using video conference technology. Completing a video interview provides an opportunity for 4-H members to practice real-world skills that are trending in the workforce.

In addition to a plaque, each 4-H State Award winner in the senior division will also receive a \$200 cash award; junior winners receive \$50 cash awards. These awards are made possible by generous donations to the Michigan 4-H Foundation.
