RESEARCH INTERESTS: Alexander is interested in governance and sustainable fisheries development. His research interest focuses on struggles over fisheries resources and livelihoods of adjacent communities. He draws on multidisciplinary theory and methods to investigate resilience, vulnerability, adaptation, and governance in small-scale fisheries.

Artisanal fisheries in Liberia provide means of livelihood for about 33,121 fishers and processors of which 60 percent are women. The sector provides more fish for local consumption and it is less environmentally damaging (less bycatch) but present more challenging management context due to its diversification, e.g., numerous landing sites some in remote areas, different fish species and different gears.

The sector is an open access under an informal management system headed by a the sea chief, a situation that encourages growing participation making communities excessively dependent on fisheries resources causing conflict among users, encouraging Illegal Unregulated and Unreported (IUU) activities threatening the sustainability of the sector leading to a situation known as tragedy of the commons. Good governance of the sector will encourage sustainable use and promote food security.

PERSONAL STATEMENT: After his studies, Alexander will like to utilize his skills in working with the artisanal fishermen in Liberia for the sustainable utilization of the fisheries. This will include working to formally structure the informal self-organizing system of the artisanal fishermen, their ways of communication, information sharing, and development of rules of reciprocity for the sustainability of the fisheries resources.
