RESEARCH INTERESTS: In Malawi's scenario, a large percentage of farmers are small scale farmers in farmer's organizations and small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). Administrative bodies and industry groups, which are in the position to support farmer's organizations and SMEs, focus mainly on cash crops such as tobacco, tea, and maize more than the cash crop pigeon peas.

Pigeon peas, however, have turned out to be an important cash crop for both local and international markets. As a result, these farmers' organizations and SMEs, which are engaged in pulses (pigeon pea) value chain, have remained uncompetitive and remain in low profit condition. Based on this, areas of research tend to focus on the main value chain actors, chain supporters, and challenges mainly affecting pigeon pea marketing in Malawi. This will lead to development of better strategies for improving the value chains with an aim of distributing profitability equally. Most smallholder farmers benefit through improved control and management of the value chain.

PERSONAL STATEMENT: Grant's experience working as an agribusiness officer in the Ministry of Agriculture Irrigation and Water Development, and also with other national and international organizations, has given him a broader view of the agribusiness sector in Malawi. He has a belief that obtaining an M.Sc. in Agribusiness Management will improve his abilities in linkage to all courses to be undergone aiming at assisting smallholder farmers in Malawi to become market-oriented.

After obtaining his M.Sc., Grant is possibly planning to pursue a Ph.D. in Agribusiness Promotion and Rural Development as Malawi is agro-based and all efforts are being directed towards commercialization of agriculture. Therefore, Grant personally would like to become a well-known researcher in the field of agribusiness and rural development.
