RESEARCH INTERESTS: Marie is interested in epidemiology of vector-borne diseases. Her proposed doctoral project is titled, "Hypothesis driven characterization of transmission factors and distribution of viruses of the Bunyaviridae family in Rwanda."

The Bunyaviridae family is composed of many viruses that cause potentially deadly diseases in humans and animals. The most common in Rwanda is Rift Valley Fever virus, which is transmitted by mosquitoes to many animal species (cattle, goats and sheep) and humans, and causes significant economic losses through abortions of animals.

Marie's research aims to analyze data from animal and human populations, as well as environmental factors in order to understand the epidemiological dynamics of these viruses and make recommendations to decision making institutions. After her Ph.D., Marie will continue doing epidemiology-related research works on other vector-borne diseases in Rwanda such as malaria, trypanosomiasis, Zika, Dengue, Chikunguniya, etc.

PERSONAL STATEMENT: Marie believes that the development of a country is achieved by education and commitment, and this is what she wants to dedicate her life to. After accomplishing her Ph.D. degree, Marie plans to concretely contribute in building the education system of her country.
