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MSU Block & Bridle Club Youth Livestock Judging Contest April 3, 2020

Registration begins at 2:00PM with the contest beginning at 3:00PM.

RULES

- 1. Entries are due along with an entry fee of \$20.00 per contestant by March 21, 2020. Late entries will be accepted for \$30.00 but preregistration is preferred.
- 2. There will be two age divisions based on **participant's age as of January 1st, 2020:** Juniors ages 9-13 and seniors ages 14-18. Senior division contestants will give two sets of oral reasons and answer one set of questions. Junior division contestants will give one set of oral reasons and answer two sets of questions.
- 3. All teams will compete in the age division of the oldest team member. Each team can be made up of three or four members. When four are entered, the three team members with the highest scores will make up the team total.
- 4. Any person, even though not competing on a team, is eligible to compete as an individual. All team members and those competing as individuals are eligible for individual awards.
- 5. Contest will include three classes of beef, two classes of sheep, and one class of goats. There will be four animals in each class. Both market and breeding stock will be judged.
- 6. Contestants will be divided into similar sized groups prior to the start of the contest. Contestants will be given 10 minutes to place each class. A group leader will collect his/her groups placing cards when time is called on each class and will supervise each group. A packet of placing cards will be given to each contestant at registration.
- 7. Each contestant must remain with his/her assigned group through the contest.

- 8. While the contest is in progress, there will be no talking or any other type of communication between contestants or coaches. If a contestant has any questions once the contest begins, please direct that question to the assigned group leader or contest coordinator. Violation of any of these rules will result in disqualification of the contestant(s).
- 9. After all of the classes have been judged there will be a brief break before oral reasons/questions will begin. Following this, the contest officials will present the official placings and cuts.
- 10. Scores will be based on a possible 50 points for each placing and 50 points for each oral reason or questions class. With 6 classes to be placed and scored and a total of 3 reasons and questions classes (see rule 2 for more details), there will be a possible score of 450 points per person and 1350 per team.
