## Promote 4-H with the 4-H Creative Campaign Contest

Youth ages 9-19 are invited to create short videos (under 60 seconds) promoting 4-H to their peers. Videos should address the question, **"Why You Should Join 4-H!**" Be a 4-H spokesperson by using your voice and sharing your 4-H story with others!

This contest is open to Michigan 4-H youth. Those not currently registered for 4-H can do so prior to entering this contest. The deadline for registration and video submissions is January 31, 2024.

A total of six prizes will be awarded to the top videos judged by professionals. There will be two age brackets for this competition:

- 4-H ages 9-13 (as of January 1, 2024)
- 4-H ages 14-19 (as of January 1, 2024)

Each age bracket will have three winners, who will receive the following prizes:

- First place prize: \$100 Amazon gift card
- Second place prize: \$75 Amazon gift card
- Third place prize: \$50 Amazon gift card

### Wanda and Dan Warner honored as Legends of 4-H



Wanda Warner, Marshall, has been involved with 4-H ever since she was a child and received her Legend of 4-H award and her 50-year pin at the Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> Leaders Banquet. Wanda shares, "It's been a lifestyle, I would say. My husband and I raised our family in 4-H. Both of us had 4-H background ourselves." Her kids, Amber and Aaron, also joined, so much of her family life revolved around 4-H activities. "Always enjoyed it, and at that point in time for country kids, there weren't a whole lot of activities to be involved in, and so we both grew up in the 4-H program and wanted those same benefits for our own children." The most valuable skill she learned and has used throughout her life is sewing. "Another leader taught me to sew, and (that) has enriched my whole life. Even today, I enjoy sewing and quilting and have won numerous awards for it."

Eventually, Wanda and her husband, Dan, became administrative leaders of one of the larger clubs, Happy Harvesters. "We also organized the 4-H Goat Club in the 1970s. That was a fun time, and we had a good group of kids," said Wanda. These days, she has an advisory role, filling in where needed, or leading a workshop when asked. Her one regret is not taking enough pictures of the projects the kids made during those many years. Her advice to other leaders is, "Take lots of pictures, so you can look back and enjoy what the kids have done years later."
