Registration is open for 4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resource Camp!

4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resources Camp is an annual three-time national awardwinning camp that mixes summer fun and hands-on science education. The camp will be held July 28 - August 3 on the shores of Lake Esau at Camp Chickagami in Presque Isle. This pre-college program is for teens who will be age 13 to 15 during camp.

Campers will increase their science literacy and stewardship as they learn from natural resource experts in fields such as Great Lakes coastal and fisheries management, limnology, wildlife, forestry, geography, geology and environmental education. In addition to hands-on learning, attendees will also enjoy exciting natural resources recreation activities such as kayaking, snorkeling, sailing, fossil hunting, archery, photography and evenings around a campfire. First-time campers also go charter fishing and learn to fillet their catch.



Registration is now open! The registration fee is \$500 and includes six nights of lodging, all meals and snacks, a t-shirt and program and activity costs. 4-H Exploration Days is Michigan 4-H's largest pre-college program and could be the highlight of your summer—maybe even change your life! This exciting event is open to any Michigan youth ages 12 –19 as of Jan. 1.

4-H Exploration Days, scheduled for June 19-21, is designed to help youth build the skills they need to successfully transition to college and to life as an adult. Michigan 4-H youth who participate have the opportunity to stay in MSU campus residence halls while attending classroom and field trip sessions.

With more than 100 session choices held on and off campus, there are topics for everyone

including animal science, business and entrepreneurship, international language and culture, performing and visual arts, and science, engineering, and technology. As youth gain important life skills like decision making, problem solving and communication, they'll also have time for fun with free time activities such as skating, basketball and a dance.

Meet 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Scott Reid



The 4-H Shooting Club is a family affair. Leader Scott Reid and wife, Julie, operate the club together and she is an instructor also. He shared, "We do this for fun. It's one of the things we do together. She enjoys doing it. We shot basically semi-pro for a number a years." They shot target and 3-D. However, the time demands for the sport got to be too much, so now they enjoy teaching 4-H children archery skills. "A couple of kids have gone to the 4-H National Shoot and have gone that far," said Reid. Every Sunday afternoon in the summer for about 13 weeks, he will be working with the kids of the 4-H shooting club. "I've been shooting archery for almost 50 years. Friends of mine were shooting, and it was something I wanted to get into, and it looked like fun. I was five, six-year-old when I first started shooting. And then I got it into at a deeper level, and I started using it as a hunting tool. I have hunted for years with archery equipment. Over the years, I have not hunted as much, but we've taken it to this level of teaching these kids archery. We're not trying to make professional archers out of them.

We're just trying to make kids aware of the equipment and what it is capable of, and what they can do with it. They've got to put effort into it to make it work."

Growing up in 4-H taught him, he shared, "If you put your mind to something, you can do whatever you want to do." He lives that motto, still today. In addition to 4-H, he works full-time at Eaton, and farms full-time, raising beef cows and buffalo. He's passing that work ethics to the kids. "We've had kids start out timid, not knowing about this archery thing, but by the end of the year they are shooting and having fun, made new friends, and they are communicating with the instructors a lot more openly than what they were initially by asking questions over the 13 to 14 weeks that we have our practices." He said, "I know the family and I wanted to help out."

Wendy Crowe, was overwhelmed that they, and over 100 people, came to pick-up everything from the remnants of their green house, chicken coop, dog kennels, and lumber. Some even brought heavy equipment to lift the heavier items. Many stayed as a bonfire was lit to get rid of destroyed materials.
