# 4-H Exploration Days 2020 June 24-26. 2020



4-H Exploration Days is Michigan 4-H's largest pre-college program and could be the highlight of your summer—maybe even change your life! This signature MSU precollege program brings youth ages 11-19 to the campus of Michigan State University to live like a college student for three days and build critical life skills for the transition to college and adulthood.

With more than 200 session choices held on and off campus, there are topics for everyone including animal science, business and entrepreneurship, international language and culture, performing and visual arts, and science, engineering, and technology. The Exploration Days <u>registration book</u> and forms are available online or you can pick one up at the MSU Extension office.

County staff will begin registration starting **March 10**. You are strongly encouraged to turn your registration form in *prior* to that date, as our office staff registers participants online in the order that they are received. Many of the sessions fill up the very first day. **The deadline to register is Friday, April 30th**, but usually by that date, most of the popular sessions are already filled, so **DON'T WAIT!** 

The 2020 cost is \$220. The fee includes meals, a shared room in a dorm, sessions and a t-shirt. An \$80 deposit is required at the time your registration form is turned in to the Calhoun County MSU Extension Office. There is an additional \$20 4-H participation fee for youth not yet enrolled in 4-H. The balance due is required no later than the <u>Orientation Meeting date on Tuesday, May 26th.</u> Youth must be age 11 by January 1st of the year they wish to attend 4-H Exploration Days. As you select your session choices, be sure to watch for age restrictions! Age requirements for sessions are based on your age as of January 1st of the current year.

If you are going or sending a youth to this event, please plan on attending the **Orientation: Tuesday May 26th, at the Fredonia Township Hall, 8803 US Hwy 27 S, Marshall 6:00-7:30pm** where you will sign up for roommates and get all the information you need for this event.

<u>Calhoun County Swine Club Scholarship</u>: Two yearly scholarships will be awarded to a high school senior or high school graduate continuing their education at an accredited institution in the year in which they are applying and must be enrolled as a Calhoun County Youth Swine Exhibitor at the time of application. Applicants may not be older than 19 years of age as of January 1st of the current year. Previous recipients are not eligible. The applicants will be judged on livestock participation, leadership, and citizenship. The scholarship is administered by the Homer Area Community Foundation and will be paid to the accredited institution in the name of the recipient. **Deadline:**March 15. Applications can be turned in at the MSU Extension office or mailed to the Homer Area Community Foundation at P.O. Box 201, Homer, MI 49245.

<u>Furu Family 4-H Legacy Scholarship:</u> Implemented to honor the Don & Virginia Furu family. Applicants must be a current or past year member of a Calhoun County 4-H Club who has exhibited at the Calhoun County Fair and high school senior who is currently accepted at a college or technical school or currently enrolled in post-secondary or a technical training program. Applicant must have a minimum high school grade point average of 2.5; and previous recipients will not be eligible in future years. **The deadline is June 30th.** A complete application must be received on or before this deadline to: MSU Extension Office, Calhoun County Building, 315 West Green Street, Marshall, MI 49068. This scholarship will be awarded at the Calhoun County Fair during the Show of Champions.

LaVern Smith Memorial Scholarship: Applicants must be a member of a 4-H Club or a Future Farmers of America (FFA) Chapter within Calhoun County, Michigan. At the time of application for this scholarship, applicants must be either a senior in high school or a high school graduate enrolled in a technical school or college. Applicants must be available for an interview if requested by the selection committee. Previous recipients are not eligible. Deadline for application is April 1. Mail or fax applications to MSU Extension 315 W Green St, Marshall, MI 49068. The LaVern Smith Memorial Scholarship selection committee shall establish the selection criteria. The committee will meet to determine the number of scholarships to be awarded and to select scholarship recipients. The recipient(s) will be announced after May 1. Scholarships will be presented to recipients during the Calhoun County Fair in August at the Fairgrounds in Marshall, Michigan. For the statewide scholarship, an applicant must be a youth exhibitor at a local, county, or statewide exhibition for a minimum of three years prior to the year of application. <u>Michigan 4-H Rabbit & Cavy Project Scholarship</u> To apply you must be a high school senior for 2019-2020 and currently enrolled in 4-H. You must have been enrolled in a 4-H rabbit/cavy project for at least three years and have financial need. Award amount: Varies, two to four given annually. Deadline is **November 1**<sup>st</sup>. #### Dining with Diabetes: Enjoy Cooking, Eating and Education!

MSU Extension's *Dining with Diabetes* is a 4-session course open to all and especially designed for people at risk of diabetes and those with diabetes and family members. Through *Dining with Diabetes*, participants learn how to prepare healthy meals using less fat, sodium and sugar without reducing flavor and enjoyment. The workshops are free and include: 4 classes, hands on cooking instruction, taste testing foods and textbook.

#### Wellness Initiative for Senior Education (WISE)

WISE is a program for adults aged 60 and older looking to stay healthy and meet new people. WISE's interactive lessons are designed to provide valuable education on topics including health and wellness, medication use, stress management, depression and substance abuse. This educational program offers six lessons that cover a wide range of topics, including: Understanding the changes associated with ageing. Aging sensitivity, Valuing cultural and generational diversity, Managing medications safely, Addressing addiction, alcohol, tobacco and other drug use, Enhancing quality of life.

Chronic Pain PATH (Personal Action Towards Health): a six-week evidence based program for people living with chronic pain. Participants learn tools to better self-manage symptoms and side effects as they face the daily challenges of living with a chronic condition like arthritis, back pain, fibromyalgia or other pain conditions.

**Matter of Balance:** is an eight-week evidence-based program that includes discussion and low impact strength and balance exercises. Participants gain the tools needed to reduce fear of falling and be more active. This includes sharing strategies within the group, setting realistic goals to increase activity, strength and balance.

**Powerful Tools for Caregivers Series:** Six lesson series taught one time a week for six weeks. Each lesson is 2.5 hours. Lessons include: Taking Care of Yourself, Identifying and Reducing Personal Stress, Communicating Feelings, Needs and Concerns, Communicating in Challenging Situations, Learning from Difficult Emotions, Mastering Caregiving Decisions. Primary Audience – informal caregivers of aging adults or adults with dementia.

**Powerful Tools for Caregivers of Special Needs Children:** Six lesson series taught one time a week for six weeks. Each lesson is 2 hours. Lessons include: Taking Care of Yourself, Identifying and Reducing Personal Stress, Communicating Feelings, Needs and Concerns, Communicating in Challenging Situations, Learning from Difficult Emotions, Mastering Caregiving Decisions. Primary Audience – parents and informal caregivers of children with challenging behaviors and emotions.

**RELAX:** Alternatives to Anger Series: Four Lessons, taught in small to large group, one time per week for four weeks. Each lesson is 1.5 hours. Topics include recognizing anger signals, ways to calm down, problem solving through conflict and forgiving and letting go of the past. Audience – any adult.

Stress Less with Mindfulness Series or One Time Workshops: Five lessons from West Virginia Extension, taught in small to large groups. Can be taught in a series or as one time presentations at community events or as work site wellness lunch and learns. Each lesson is 1 - 1.5 hours. Lesson titles: Introduction to Mindfulness, Mindful Eating, Mindful Walking and Thought Surfing, Be Kind to Your Mind and Laughter is Good Medicine. Audience – any adult.

Class series and workshops provided in a variety of community locations. Some fees may apply.


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# Calhoun County 4-H Youth participate in a 4-H Welding Program!
