The new 4-H program year has started so it is time to re-enroll with Calhoun County 4-H. **The deadline for returning members to enroll is December 1, 2020**.

4-H Online has upgraded to 4-H Online 2.0! This new system looks different, but should be pretty easy to navigate. You will use your same 4-H Online log in and password that you have used in the past. **Please do not create a new account.** If you do not remember your password, please contact the office at 269-781-0784 and we can reset your password. Everyone must re-enroll to be included as part of this year's program. **4-H enrollment fees have been waived for this year**. There may still be some clubs that charge club dues, but that will be up to each individual club. If you are not actively participating (this means attending meetings and activities throughout the year) in a club, but would like to be a 4-H member, please register in the Independent Club. This gives you 4-H membership, but does not allow you to show at the fair. This is important to keep rosters accurate and for the reporting that we need to do.
