- Each candidate must be enrolled in the Clare County 4-H program.
- You must complete and return these forms:
  - o The Personal Information Cover Sheet (PICS) form
  - o 4-H Ambassador Code of Conduct
  - o 4-H Ambassadors Activities, Responsibilities and Dress Code Agreement
- Each candidate is to write a one (1) page essay (typed, double spaced, 12 font). Handwritten essays for Junior applicants are acceptable.
- Essay must include:
  - o An introduction including their 4-H interests (past/present and future).
  - o What 4-H means to them.
  - o An explanation as to why they want to serve as a 4-H Ambassador for Clare County.
- The application must be returned to 4-H Program Coordinator.
  - o You may deliver the application by email, mail or in-person.
- You will attend an in-person interview.
- Once inducted, you will be recognized and also announced during the Clare County 4-H Awards Ceremony.
- You must attend at least 3 three community events throughout the year, whether they're 4-H related or general community gatherings. However, the more events you participate in, the more you'll grow as a leader and advocate for positive change.

The Michigan 4-H Youth Program prides itself on providing quality educational programs for youths. The primary purpose of this code is to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all 4-H participants.

- Accept the responsibility to promote and support 4-H to develop effective county, state and national programs.
- Accept the responsibility to represent Clare County and Michigan 4-H youth programs with the dignity and pride by being positive role models for youth.
- Conduct yourself in a courteous, respectful manner, exhibit good sportsmanship, show positive attitude and values, and provide a good role model for other youth both personally and educationally.
- Recognize that abuse by physical or verbal means, failure to comply with equal opportunity and anti-discrimination laws, or a criminal act will be grounds for dismissal as a 4-H representative.
- Under no circumstances will a 4-H Ambassador consume alcohol and/or illegal drugs (including no smoking) or operate machinery, vehicles, and other equipment in an irresponsible manner.

It is important that all 4-H Ambassadors comply with the Code of Conduct. Failure to comply with any component of the Code may lead to dismissal.

## 4-H Ambassador Activities, Responsibilities and Dress Code Agreement

The Michigan 4-H Youth Program prides itself on providing quality educational programs for youths. The primary purpose of this agreement is to ensure that 4-H Ambassadors recognize and agree to the requirements of the program they wish to participate in.

- **Portraits** – A picture will be taken of you with your 4-H Ambassador sash at the Clare County 4-H Award Ceremony. Following the award ceremony, a group photo will be taken of all 4-H Ambassadors.
- **Fair Week** - Various duties will be asked of you throughout the week. These will include but are not limited to:
  - Award ribbons and trophies at the barn awards week of fair.
  - Assist in leading the American and 4-H pledges when asked.
  - Greet buyers at both Small and Large Animal auctions.
  - Work in the 4-H Milk Booth when needed.
  - Help with the 4-H Cloverbud Show on Thursday.
  - Make yourself known at the fair.
  - Assist with 4-H Fun Night.
  - Help with any of the weekly games and fun activities hosted by 4-H
- **Clare County Awards Ceremony** – Help present awards, hand out prizes, manage drink and food table, give speeches, greet guests, help set up and break down event.
- **Parades / Festivals** – You are encouraged throughout the year to be present and help at various social gatherings throughout the year:
  - Help with 4-H float building and other activities as designated.
  - Appear in parades.
  - Connect with the 4-H Program Coordinator, council members, or club leaders to assist them with 4-H promotion at local festivals or events.
- **Workshops/Clinics** – Appear at any opportunity to represent Clare County 4-H as a guest speaker at community service clubs, 4-H clubs, schools, etc. as possible.
- **Other Events** – In an effort to promote 4-H, other events may be added as we become aware. You will be contacted by email or phone with any other event instructions you may need throughout your service year.
- **Dress Code** –
  - Business professional for things like interviews and portraits. Business casual for events.
  - Dress in dress clothes, such as dress pants, black or tan, dress, skirt, NO JEANS! Dress shorts are allowed but must be below fingertips when arms are down including dresses/skirts. A nice shirt, such as a polo or button up dress shirt, NO printed T-shirts unless it is a 4-H related t-shirt, NO tank tops allowed! No stains! Shirts are to be tucked in at all times.
  - You will have a sash and or a T-shirt that will be provided to you that you are to wear when you are representing Clare County 4-H as an Ambassador.
