
#### 2023 BUYERS APPRECIATION DINNER

#### MAFE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY

MAFE is a strong partner of MSU Extension. MAFE (Michigan Association of Fairs & Exhibitions) is offering up to 6 \$1,000 scholarships in 2024. This scholarship is open to applicants who are high school seniors or currently enrolled in an institution of advanced learning such as a college, university, or trade school. #### 2023 MAFE Scholarship Procedures & Guidelines

- 1. Each year up to six (6) scholarships of \$1,000 may be awarded, one being the Neil Kentner memorial scholarship.
- 2. Scholarship is open to applicants who are high school seniors or currently enrolled in an institution of advanced learning such as a college, university, or trade school. (If the applicant is a high school senior they must have submitted an application to an advanced learning institution.)
- 3. Applications must be RECEIVED by November 2 via email listed below.
- 4. Scholarship winners will be announced at the Annual MAFE Convention.
- 5. Recipients may apply each year they are enrolled in the institution but shall not be eligible to receive a scholarship more than 2 years.
- 6. The scholarship can be used for all expenses related to the applicants' continued education.
- 7. The full amount of the scholarship will be paid at the MAFE Annual Convention. If the attendee is not present at the convention, the scholarship will be mailed to the address listed in the application by April 1.
- 8. Applications must be typed and submitted as a PDF file. Applications can be found on the MAFE website at mifairs.com under the Convention page.
- 9. The applicant must be involved in a MAFE member fair or festival for the prior 3 years. This can include exhibiting, volunteering, etc.
- 10.Applications must be received by November 2. Send by email to: michiganfairs@gmail.com Subject: MAFE scholarship and include applicant's full name

### National 4-H Week: October 1-7, 2023

Fore more than 100 years, 4-H has inspired families, shaped careers, and impacted communities. From October 1-7, we will celebrate the impact of 4-H during National 4-H Week. The theme of this year's National 4-H Week is "I 4-H." As you plan ahead for how you will mark National 4-H Week in your community, here are some ideas of you can celebrate 4-H and show all the ways you 4-H!

**Wear Your 4-H Gear** — Nothing says 4-H pride like a 4-H tee! Dress yourself (or the entire family – pets included!) in 4-H green and clover gear.

**Share Your 4-H Story** — Take to social media to share a 4-H memory, express how 4-H shaped who you are today, describe what 4-H means to you, post an old 4-H photo, or shout-out your 4-H club.

**Send a 4-H 'Thank You'** — We all have a reason to thank our local 4-H staff, leaders and supporters. To show your appreciation, send a handwritten 'thank you' note to someone who has supported youth and made a difference.
