- ➤ Gold- For volunteers that will be working directly with kids on a regular basis or if you will be handling money. Includes a background check, 3 references, interview and online trainings.
- Silver– For volunteers that plan to work a fair job, work with registration, hand out ribbons or work a gate at 4-H events. This volunteer type will run your background check.

#### SCHOLARSHIPS FOR JUNIORS AND SENIORS

If you are a newly graduated Senior or entering your 2nd year of college, here are a few great opportunities to earn a scholarship! These applications are to be completed by July 1st, 2023. Contact the Extension Office for an Application.

- ➤ <u>Sleight Memorial Scholarship</u> This scholarship offers \$1000 to a student attending MSU.
- ➤ <u>Clinton County 4-H Scholarship</u> This is for all the newly graduated seniors, offering \$1000 toward a 2- or 4-year degree.
- ➤ <u>Clinton County Fair Board Scholarship</u> This is for all college students entering their second year of college, offering a chance at two (2) \$500 one-time scholarships; one to a recipient enrolled in an associate or bachelor's degree program, and the second to a recipient in a vocational training or certification program.

#### **FAIR JOBS**

If you have not signed up for a Fair Job there are still slots to fill. We ask that all youth and an adult from each family volunteer for a fair job. Without wonderful volunteers helping to fill the jobs during fair week we would not be able to have a successful Fair. Remember that if you are an adult volunteering for a fair job, you must be a registered volunteer.

#### **FAIR SET UP**

Fair setup will take place Saturday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>, starting at 9 am and running until everything has been completed. Many hands make light work! With your help, we plan to be done by 1 pm.

#### STALL DEPOSITS

Stall deposits can be paid July 10<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> at the Clinton County MSU Extension Office in the Garden Level of the Clinton County Courthouse between 9 am and 4 pm. They may also be paid at the Fair Office (on the Clinton County 4-H Fairgrounds) at Livestock set up on Saturday, July 22<sup>nd</sup>, from 10 am – 12 noon, other times are available by appointment.

- \* NEW THIS YEAR we will be doing stall reservations through the Fair Entry process, please answer these questions as to how many stalls are needed. This question may be asked multiple times depending on how many entries are in each division. You only need to answer it once. If you answer this question multiple times, we will be able to weed them out. Remember we arrange space for animals based on the space reserved. Failure to reserve stall space by the deadline will result in a non-refundable \$50.00 fee.
- \*Members must have their stall card before bringing animals in on Saturday.
