Conservation Stewards help protect and restore Michigan's natural areas and ecosystems. They teach others about ecosystems and natural communities, help remove invasive species, build trails, collect data used in making management decisions, and work with naturalists, biologists, and land managers to preserve public land. The Conservation Stewards Program will help you gain the skills to lead or contribute to land stewardship efforts in your local area. Upon completion of specified program requirements, the option to become an MSU Extension Conservation Stewards Volunteer is available after the program concludes.

Professional-level instruction is provided by MSU Extension, Michigan Natural Features Inventory, and other local experts.

PROGRAM DETAILS

The Conservation Stewards Program is a 10-week course consisting of virtual classes on Wednesday evenings. Participants will be offered self-guided field sessions with direction from local partners. Additional coursework is completed online.
