

Creating a Miniature Landscape: Benefits of Hands-on Activities with Plants & Nature

Join Tollgate gardeners and supporters in the conference center for a hands-on activity and the last membership meeting of 2025. Participants will create a miniature landscape by planting small plants and making a path, pond, fence and more. Express your creativity in this project while enjoying conversation on the benefits of plants and nature.

Horticultural Therapist, Cathy Flinton will provide all materials—soil mix, small plants, rocks, shells, bark, miniature "benches" and other items—to create a miniature landscape. You are free to bring your own container, maybe a plant saucer (12" round, 3-4" deep) or something similar, possibly smaller, for your indoor garden. Cathy works with traumatic brain injury patients in a conservatory with activities designed to help them grow physically, mentally and socially. Cathy is a past president of the Michigan Horticultural Therapy Association (MHTA). She has a BS in Horticulture from MSU.

PAR Report - Kathryn Fitzpatrick





October is our final harvest month, and we are on a roll – 1900 lbs. donated with only a couple more harvest weeks to go! We have had generous donations from the Sustainable Agriculture – CSA team as well as other vegetable growers in the garden with surplus vegetables. These additional donations are most appreciated and provide extra produce for Forgotten Harvest, Northville Civic Concerns, and PB & J who serve those in need in surrounding communities.

We had an exceptional potato harvest with 373 lbs. of beautiful golden and red potatoes. The tomatillos, hot peppers, kale, and green beans have been prolific. The turnips planted using the seed tape are already being harvested – both the greens and the bulbs are perfect. One fun surprise were the giant green onions – they sure smelled wonderful. Kohlrabi has proven to be a nice addition with a robust yield of healthy bulbs. The pelleted seed carrots provided a good yield with healthy greens and roots.

Possibly on the chopping block due to less than worthy yields this year are herbs, cucumbers, leeks, and shallots. The onions, squash, and cabbage yields were reasonable, but we will be looking into different cultivars for larger and more robust vegetables.

Two final activities for the season are the planting of garlic beds, and our end-of-season potluck meeting to discuss the good, the great, the bad, and the ugly and make plans for 2026.

NURSERY NOTES - Peg Palmer

SUMMER 2025 HAS BEEN ANOTHER GREAT YEAR FOR THE NURSERY! We hosted two successful Plant Sales that brought in a total of almost \$13,000! All plant sale proceeds go to support all the beautiful gardens that are maintained by the dedicated efforts of the Tollgate Garden Volunteers.

October 11 is the last day the Nursery will be accepting donations, so we can begin winter preparations. This begins with an inventory of what we have so that we can develop a winter plan. While many plants overwinter well in pots, some are more challenged by the typical Michigan freeze/thaw cycle that traps moisture in the pot and can damage the roots. Over the years, we have evolved our strategies for these vulnerable plants, including un-potting selected plants and "heeling in" the Nursery row for the winter, and repotting in spring. This requires diligent record keeping to know what's needed to stock up for the Spring Sale 2026, and plants in pots are easier to keep track of than plants heeled in the ground!

And, speaking of pots - the Nursery is delighted to recycle the 1-gallon pots that you may find as you clean up your shed or garage this fall! Please leave clean 1-gallon pots, in good condition, in the plant storage area (yellow door at the SE corner of the Nursery). Please DO NOT leave pots larger than the standard 1 gallon size!

It is our goal to have all gardens with this information to enhance educational value and enjoyment for all visitors.


