Processed Industrial Hemp and CBD Products: A Guide on Legality in Michigan

The Bureau of Marijuana Regulation (BMR) and the Michigan Dept of Agriculture & Rural Development (MDARD) <u>issued joint guidance</u> on March 29, 2019 regarding CBD (cannabidiol) and industrial hemp. Michigan companies must not only follow this guide, but also comply with other state and federal laws that apply to their product, such as the <u>US Food and Drug Administration regulations</u>, the <u>Michigan Food and Dairy Laws</u>, the <u>Commercial Feed</u> requirements, and the <u>Michigan Weights and Measures Program</u>.

Industrial Hemp Products For Human Consumption – LEGAL

The products below, processed from industrial hemp, are Generally Recognized As Safe (GRAS) by the FDA and therefore **LEGAL** to process and sell in Michigan for <u>Human Consumption</u>. This requires a <u>Processor-Handler License</u> (\$1,350) which includes passing a background check.

- Hulled Hemp Seed
- Hemp Seed Protein
- Hemp Seed Oil

Industrial Hemp Products for Animal Feed - NOT LEGAL

Currently, products processed from industrial hemp are not considered GRAS for animal feed and therefore **NOT LEGAL** to process and sell in Michigan for <u>Animal Consumption</u>. Such products are governed by the FDA and guidance can be found on the <u>Association of American Food Control Officials website</u>.

Industrial Hemp CBD Products For Human Topical Use – See LEGAL Products Below

The below products derived from industrial hemp with THC concentration below .3% are **LEGAL** to process and sell in Michigan.

MDARD requires meeting the requirements of the <u>Industrial Hemp Ag-Pilot</u> <u>Program</u> in effect up through October 31, 2020. Also, manufacturers will need a Hemp <u>Processor-Handler License</u> (\$1,350) to process and sell these products in the State of Michigan. These products are regulated by the FDA who is

currently working on a regulatory framework.

- CBD Oil (label cannot state it is for human consumption)
- Soap
- Cosmetics: As defined by FDA, Cosmetics include "skin moisturizers," perfumes, lipsticks, fingernail polishes, eye and facial makeup, cleansing shampoos, permanent waves, hair colors, and deodorants, as well as any substance intended for use as a component of a cosmetic product."

Industrial Hemp CBD Products – See Products NOT LEGAL

According to MDARD, the below products derived from industrial hemp with THC concentration below .3% are **NOT LEGAL** to process and sell in Michigan since they are not approved by FDA at this time.

- Dietary Supplements as defined by FDA
- Drugs as defined by FDA
- Food and Beverages for Human Consumption
- Beer and Wine (governed by the MLCC)
- **Animal Feed**
