What is AIMS?

The ANR Institute for Multicultural Students (AIMS), sponsored by the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR) at Michigan State University, is a one-week program designed to give high school students a broad exposure to the food and agricultural sciences, natural resources, and related fields. Some may ask, "Why a program in agriculture and natural resources?" A career in agriculture or natural resources involves a lot more than farming. There are a wide variety of educational and career opportunities in the food and agricultural sciences: environment, natural resouces and conservation; business, management and design; food and health; plant and animal biology; communities, education and human services; technology and management; and education.

The College of Agriculture and Natural Resources at MSU is the perfect place to learn more about these career areas, and AIMS is the perfect way to learn about the college.

Who Participates in AIMS?

Participants in this program are 9th-11th grade students who are open minded and interested in learning about new and different career areas. Students are selected for AIMS based on their interests and their academic performance in high school. They are known by their teachers and counselors as students who are interested in science, math, business, or related areas.

What Do AIMS Participants Do?

They participate in demonstrations, tours, and other hands-on activities designed to give them a sample of what the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources has to offer. They also have the opportunity to participate in a number of other educational, cultural, and social activities. During their week on campus, AIMS participants will comingle with students from the Multicultural Apprenticeship Program (MAP) for leadership evenina seminars and activities. Students from both programs live in the university residence halls and have their meals in the dining halls with students from other pre-college programs.

How Much Does It Cost?

The AIMS program is free.

The program is supported by the MSU College of Agriculture and Natural Resources and a number of other public and private agencies and corporations. Students are responsible for providing their own transportation to and from the MSU campus.

When is AIMS?

The program begins Sunday, July 9, and runs through Friday, July 14, 2017.


